6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
7	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 15A-534 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:	
8	"(j) An order of pretrial release takes effect immediately and remains in effect until the	
9	charges are disposed of, regardless of whether a defendant is incarcerated or released."	
10	<b>SECTION 2.</b> G.S. 15A-534.1 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:	
11	"(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, at the initial appearance of a defendant	
12	immediately following the defendant's arrest, a judicial official authorized by this Article to set	
13	conditions of pretrial release may order that the defendant have no contact with the alleged victim	
14	of the crime while the defendant awaits the determination of pretrial release conditions pursuant	
15	to subsections (a) and (b)."	
16	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
