

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO MAKE CHANGES TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE PRINCIPAL FELLOWS 3 COMMISSION, TO CLARIFY THE AUTHORITY OF THE COMMISSION OVER THE 4 TRANSFORMING PRINCIPAL PREPARATION PROGRAM AND VARIOUS OTHER 5 CHANGES TO THE PROGRAM, AND TO TRANSFER THE FUNDS AND 6 ADMINISTRATION OF INDIVIDUAL FORGIVABLE SCHOLARSHIP LOANS FROM THE PRINCIPAL FELLOWS PROGRAM TO THE PRINCIPAL FELLOWS AND 7 8 TRANSFORMING PRINCIPAL PREPARATION GRANT PROGRAM. 9 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1.(a) G.S. 116-74.41 reads as rewritten: 10 "§ 116-74.41. North Carolina Principal Fellows Commission established; membership. 11 12 There is established the North Carolina Principal Fellows Commission. The (a) 13 Commission shall exercise its powers and duties independently of the Board of Governors of The 14 University of North Carolina. Carolina in its administration of the Principal Fellows Program 15 under this Article and the Transforming Principal Preparation Grant Program under Part 4 of Article 23 of this Chapter. The Director of the Principal Fellows Program shall staff the 16 17 Commission. The State Education Assistance Authority (SEAA) as created in G.S. 116-203 shall 18 be responsible for (i) implementing scholarship loan agreements, monitoring, cancelling through 19 service, collecting and otherwise enforcing the agreements for the Principal Fellows Program 20 scholarship loans established in accordance with G.S. 116-74.42.G.S. 116-74.42 and (ii) 21 awarding grants for the Transforming Principal Preparation Grant Program upon the selection of the recipients by the Commission in accordance with G.S. 116-209.71. 22 23 (a1) Repealed by Session Laws 2018-5, s. 10A.3(a), effective July 1, 2018. (4) One public school teacher appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

24	SECTION 2.(e) Part 4 of Article 23 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is
25	amended by adding a new section to read:
26	" <u>§ 116-209.76. Terms of forgivable scholarship loans.</u>
27 28	(a) <u>Notes. – All forgivable scholarship loans shall be evidenced by notes made payable</u> to the Authority that bear interest at a rate not to exceed ten percent (10%) per year as set by the
28 29	Authority and beginning 90 days after completion of the school leader preparation program, or
30	90 days after termination of the loan, whichever is earlier. The funds from the forgivable
31	scholarship loan shall be disbursed directly to the grantee on behalf of the recipient for
32	participation in the school leader preparation program. The forgivable scholarship loan may be
33	terminated upon the recipient's withdrawal from the preparation program or by the recipient's
34	failure to meet the standards set by the Commission or the grantee.
35	(b) Forgiveness. – The Authority shall forgive the total amount of a forgivable
36	scholarship loan and any interest accrued on the loan if, within seven years after graduation from
37	a school leader preparation program, exclusive of any authorized deferment for extenuating
38	circumstances, the recipient serves as a school administrator at a North Carolina public school
39	for four years. A program participant shall be eligible for a forgivable scholarship loan in the
40	amount of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) per year for up to two years in the program, with a
41	maximum loan amount of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) per participant.
42	For each year of qualifying service, the recipient shall have twenty-five percent (25%) of the
43	total amount of the loan forgiven, regardless of whether the recipient serves for the entire four
44 45	years as a school administrator in a North Carolina public school. The Commission, in collaboration with the grantees, shall monitor the acceptability of service repayment agreements
45 46	and compliance of the recipient with the agreement. The Commission shall notify the Authority
40 47	of any relevant information or change in the circumstances pertaining to the recipient impacting
48	the enforcement of the promissory note. A forgivable scholarship loan shall also be forgiven if
49	the Commission finds it is impossible for the recipient to work for four years as a school
50	administrator, within seven years after completion of the preparation program supported by the
51	loan, because of the death or permanent disability of the recipient. If the recipient repays the

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1 forgivable scholarship loan by cash payments to the Authority, all indebtedness shall be repaid 2 within 12 years after completion of the school leader preparation program supported by the loan. 3 If the recipient completes the school leader preparation program, payment of principal and 4 interest shall begin no later than 27 months after the completion of the program. Should a 5 recipient present extenuating circumstances, the Authority may extend the period to repay the 6 forgivable scholarship loan in cash to no more than a total of 15 years." 7 **SECTION 3.(a)** Article 5C of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is repealed. 8 SECTION 3.(b) Part 4 of Article 23 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes, as 9 amended by Section 2 of this act, reads as rewritten: 10 "Part 4. 46	SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Office of State Budget

As the terms of the members serving on the Principal Fellows and 6 TP3 Commission in accordance with this section expire, or when a vacancy occurs prior to the 7 expiration of a term, members on the Commission shall be appointed in accordance with 8 G.S. 116-209.71. 9 **SECTION 6.** Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective July 1, 2019, and apply

SECTION 6. Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective July 1, 2019, and apply to the administration of the Transforming Principal Preparation Grant Program and the award of grants under the Program on or after that date.
