2	AN ACT TO ADJUST LICENSE PLATE AGENCY PAY RATES AND REQUIRE THE
3	DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO INCLUDE COMMISSION CONTRACTOR
4	OPTION IN DIVISION ADVERTISING.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. G.S. 20-63(h) reads as rewritten:
7	"(h) Commission Contracts for Issuance of Plates and Certificates. – All registration
8	plates, registration certificates, and certificates of title issued by the Division, outside of those
9	issued from the office of the Division located in Wake, Cumberland, or Mecklenburg Counties
10	and those issued and handled through the United States mail, shall be issued insofar as practicable
11	and possible through commission contracts entered into by the Division for the issuance of the
12	plates and certificates in localities throughout North Carolina, including military installations
13	within this State, with persons, firms, corporations or governmental subdivisions of the State of
14	North Carolina. The Division shall make a reasonable effort in every locality, except as noted
15	above, to enter into a commission contract for the issuance of the plates and certificates and a
16	record of these efforts shall be maintained in the Division. In the event the Division is
17	unsuccessful in making commission contracts, it shall issue the plates and certificates through
18	the regular employees of the Division. Whenever registration plates, registration certificates, and
19	certificates of title are issued by the Division through commission contract arrangements, the
20	Division shall provide proper supervision of the distribution. Nothing contained in this subsection
21	allows or permits the operation of fewer outlets in any county in this State than are now being
22	operated.
23	The terms of a commission contract entered under this subsection shall specify the duration
24	of the contract and either include or incorporate by reference standards by which the Division
25	may supervise and evaluate the performance of the commission contractor. The duration of an
26	initial commission contract may not exceed eight years and the duration of a renewal commission
27	contract may not exceed two years. The Division may award monetary performance bonuses, not
28	to exceed an aggregate total of ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000) annually, to commission
29	contractors based on their performance.

The amount of compensation payable to a commission contractor is determined on a per transaction basis. <u>The standard transaction rate is two dollars (\$2.00)</u>. The collection of the highway use tax and the removal of an inspectiona registration stop are each considered a separate transaction for which one dollar and thirty cents (\$1.30)-compensation <u>at three-fourths</u> the standard transaction rate shall be paid. <u>The collection of a civil penalty imposed by</u> <u>G.S. 20-311 for a lapse in financial responsibility is a separate transaction for which</u> <u>compensation at two times the standard transaction rate shall be paid</u>. The issuance of a limited



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1	registration "T" sticker and the collection of property tax are each considered a separate	arate
2	transaction for which compensation at the rate of one dollar and thirty cents (\$1.30) and	one
3	dollar and eight cents (\$1.08) respectively, shall be paid by counties and municipalities as a	cost
4	of the combined motor vehicle registration renewal and property tax collection system.

13	SECTION 2. Article 3 of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by ad	ding
14	a new section to read:	
15	"§ 20-63.03 Division advertising must include commission contractor option.	
16	When the Division advertises the methods by which a vehicle owner may title or regis	ter a
17	vehicle, the advertising must include the option to obtain a title or register a vehicle at the o	ffice
18	of a commission contractor. The advertising may not encourage the public to choose one me	thod
19	over another or state or imply that choosing to title or register a vehicle at the office	of a
20	commission contractor is a less desirable option."	
21	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2019. Section 1 applie	es to
22	amounts collected and transactions performed on or after that date.
