2	AN ACT TO FUND REPAIRS AND RENOVATIONS PROJECTS FOR STATE AGENCIES
3	AND THE CONSTITUENT INSTITUTIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH
4	CAROLINA AND TO ENACT VARIOUS STATUTORY CHANGES RELATING TO
5	FUNDING AND COMMENCING CAPITAL PROJECTS FROM THE STATE CAPITAL
6	AND INFRASTRUCTURE FUND.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	SECTION 1.(a) There is transferred from the General Fund to the State Capital and
9	Infrastructure Fund a sum sufficient in nonrecurring funding for the 2020-2021 fiscal year.
10	SECTION 1.(b) There is appropriated from the State Capital and Infrastructure Fund
11	to the Office of State Budget and Management a sum sufficient in nonrecurring funding for the
12	2020-2021 fiscal year to be allocated for repairs and renovations projects pursuant to
13	G.S. 143C-8-13.
14	SECTION 2.(a) Of the funds appropriated in Section 1(b) of this act, the following
15	allocations are made to the following agencies for repairs and renovations pursuant to
16	G.S. 143C-8-13:
17	(1) Forty percent (40%) of the amount appropriated in this act from the State
18	Capital and Infrastructure Fund shall be allocated for repairs and renovations
19	at the constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina, as
20	determined by the Board of Governors.
21	(2) Sixty percent (60%) of the amount appropriated in this act from the State
22	Capital and Infrastructure Fund shall be allocated for repairs and renovations
23	for State agencies, excluding The University of North Carolina.
24	The Office of State Budget and Management shall consult with or report to the Joint
25	Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations, as appropriate, in accordance with
26	G.S. 143C-8-13(b). The Board of Governors shall report to the Joint Legislative Commission on
27	Governmental Operations in accordance with G.S. 143C-8-13(b). Notwithstanding
28	G.S. 143C-8-13, of the funds allocated in subdivision (2) of this subsection, a sum sufficient shall
29	be allocated to the Department of Revenue for security improvements at various locations
30	throughout the State.
31	SECTION 2.(b) Funds allocated under this section that may be expended on projects
32	where the recipient intends or expects to receive insurance proceeds or State or federal aid or
33	assistance shall be used only to the extent that funds received from the settlement of a claim for

- loss or damage covered under the recipient's applicable insurance policy, or other aid or assistance, are insufficient to cover all damages sustained as a result of Hurricane Florence.
 - **SECTION 3.(a)** G.S. 143C-8-13 reads as rewritten:

Repairs and Renovations. 1 2 Use of Funds. - Funds-Except as otherwise provided for in this section, funds for (a) repairs and renovations shall be available for expenditure only upon an act of appropriation by 3 4 the General Assembly. Funds appropriated for repairs and renovations shall be used only for 5 State facilities and related infrastructure that are supported from the General Fund or the State Capital and Infrastructure Fund and for Department of Information Technology facilities and 6 7 related infrastructure. Funds appropriated for repairs and renovations projects shall not be used 8 for new construction or the expansion of the building area (sq. ft.) of an existing facility unless required in order to comply with federal or State codes or standards. Allowable projects include 9 10 any of the following: 11 12 (c) Notwithstanding any provision of G.S. 143C-8-7 to the contrary, the chancellor of a 13 constituent institution of The University of North Carolina may pay for projects for repairs and 14 renovations with funds available to the constituent institution according to the following: 15 The project meets all of the following requirements: (1)The total project costs do not exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000). 16 a. 17 The project is one of the types set forth in subdivisions (1) through b. (13) of subsection (a) of this section, regardless of whether the relevant 18 19 facilities and related infrastructure are supported from the General 20 Fund or the State Capital and Infrastructure Fund. 21 (2) The constituent institution reports on projects undertaken pursuant to this subsection to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina and 22 the Fiscal Research Division on a quarterly basis. The report shall include all 23 24 of the following information for each project: 25 The facility at which the project is being undertaken. a. 26 b. The nature and scope of the project. 27 The source of funds for the project. <u>c.</u> 28 d. The category of projects set forth in subsection (a) of this section that 29 the project falls within. 30 (3) Any funds from a General Fund appropriation that are contractually obligated for a project pursuant to this subsection shall not revert at the end of the fiscal 31 32 year but shall remain available to fund the completion of the project. 33 In making campus allocations of funds allocated to the Board of Governors of The (d) 34 University of North Carolina for the purposes described in subsection (a) of this section, the 35 Board of Governors shall negatively weight the availability of non-State resources and 36 carryforward funds available for repairs and renovations and shall include information about the 37 manner in which this subsection was complied with in any report submitted pursuant to this 38 section." 39 **SECTION 3.(b)** G.S. 143C-8-7 reads as rewritten: 40 "§ 143C-8-7. When a State agency may begin a capital improvement project. 41 No State agency may expend funds for the construction or renovation of any capital (a) 42 improvement project except as needed to comply with this Article or otherwise authorized by the 43 General Assembly. Funds that become available by gifts, excess patient receipts above those 44 budgeted at the University of North Carolina Hospitals at Chapel Hill, federal or private grants, 45 receipts becoming a part of special funds by act of the General Assembly, or any other funds 46 available to a State agency or institution may be utilized for advanced planning through the 47 working drawing phase of capital improvement projects, upon approval of the Director of the 48 Budget. 49 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is authorized to utilize the types of funds described in 50 subsection (a) of this section to build equipment structures that meet the description contained in 51

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1	(f) Funds Available Only Upon Appropriation. – Funds reserved to the Fund shall be
2	available for expenditure only upon an act of appropriation by the General Assembly.
3	(g) Unexpended Funds Funds appropriated for a project that are unspent and
4	unencumbered upon completion of the project shall revert to the Fund.
5	(h) In each fiscal year, the Office of State Budget and Management may reallocate
6	appropriations from the State Capital and Infrastructure Fund between projects to meet cash flow
7	requirements for a project, provided that the following criteria are met:
8	(1) If the project for which funds have been appropriated is for one of the
9	constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina, then
10	unencumbered funds may be allocated from another project for a constituent
11	institution of The University of North Carolina for which funds have been
12	appropriated.
13	(2) If the project for which funds have been appropriated is for a State agency that
14	is not The University of North Carolina, then unencumbered funds may be
15	allocated from another project for a State agency for which funds have been
16	appropriated.
17	(3) The amount disbursed will not exceed amounts appropriated from the State
18	Capital and Infrastructure Fund.
19	(4) The amount disbursed on any project cannot exceed the amount authorized
20	for that project.
21	(5) The amount reallocated cannot be used to expand the scope of the project.
22	(6) <u>A project shall not begin until the fiscal year authorized by the General</u>
23	Assembly."
24	SECTION 3.(g) G.S. 143-341(3)b1. reads as rewritten:
25	"b1. To certify that a statement of needs pursuant to G.S. 143C-3-3, other
26	than for a project of The University of North Carolina for which
27	advance planning has not been completed, is feasible. For purposes of
28	this sub-subdivision, "feasible" means that the proposed project is
29	sufficiently defined in overall scope; building program; site
30	development; detailed design, construction, and equipment budgets;
31	and comprehensive project scheduling so as to reasonably ensure that
32	it may be completed with the amount of funds requested. At the
33	discretion of the General Assembly, advanced planning funds may be
34	appropriated in support of this certification. This sub-subdivision shall
35	not apply to requests for appropriations of less than one hundred
36	thousand dollars (\$100,000). below the formal project limit, as set by
37	the State Building Commission."
38	SECTION 4.(a) The provisions of the State Budget Act, Chapter 143C of the
39 40	General Statutes, are reenacted and shall remain in full force and effect and are incorporated in
40	this act by reference.
41	SECTION 4.(b) Departmental receipts, as defined in G.S. 143C-1-1, are
42 43	appropriated for the 2020-2021 fiscal year up to the amounts needed to implement the provisions
43 44	in this act for the 2020-2021 fiscal year.
44 45	SECTION 4.(c) Except where expressly repealed or amended by this act, the provisions of any other legislation expected during the 2010 Begular Session of the Constraint
43 46	provisions of any other legislation enacted during the 2019 Regular Session of the General
40 47	Assembly expressly appropriating funds to an agency, a department, or an institution covered under this act shall remain in effect.
