2018-49, it is the intent of the General Assembly to enact legislation during the 2020 Regular

Session of the 2019 General Assembly that will replace the Hospital Provider Assessment Act in

Article 7 of Chapter 108A of the General Statutes with a similar hospital provider assessment. In developing this similar hospital provider assessment, it is the intent of the General Assembly to further impose upon these same hospital providers a Medicaid Coverage Gap Assessment that will pay for the State share of the program and administrative costs associated with Medicaid expansion.

**SECTION 4.** The sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2020-2021 fiscal year is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Benefits, for planning and preparation related to implementation of the Medicaid coverage in this act.

**SECTION 5.** Except as otherwise provided, this bill is effective when it becomes law.

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
