#### **FISCAL IMPACT SUMMARY**

**NET LOCAL IMPACT** 

This bill gives the existing Charlotte Citizen's Review Board subpoena powers, with corresponding authority to apply to the General Court of Justice, Superior Court Division, for an order requiring compliance with the subpoena should the subpoenaed party refuse to cooperate. This bill will have either no fiscal impact or a de minimis fiscal impact on both the City of Charlotte and the Administrative Office of the Courts.

#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

The bill provides for a small expansion in the authority given to the existing Charlotte Citizen's Review Board. In evaluating this bill, Fiscal Research consulted with both the City of Charlotte and the Administrative Office of the Courts. Neither entity anticipates any significant increase in expenses as a result of the Board potentially exercising this new power. Some additional court time may be required to evaluate a subpoena enforcement petition from the Review Board, should

one be submitted; however, this time will likely be de minimis and will not require any additional funding.
