A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ALLOW PHYSICIANS TO PRESCRIBE CERTAIN MEDICATIONS FOR OFF-LABEL USES.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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SECTION 1. Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 90-12.8. Limited prescription or treatment authority for certain diseases.

- (a) A physician licensed to practice medicine under this Article may prescribe a therapeutic drug approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for off-label use to a patient for at-home, early-stage outpatient or hospital inpatient treatment of coronavirus infections causing respiratory syndrome—related illnesses. A physician acting in good faith in accordance with this section shall not solely constitute immoral or dishonorable conduct, as defined in G.S. 90-14(a)(1), or unprofessional conduct, as defined in G.S. 90-14(a)(6).
- (b) Nothing in this section shall be construed to grant greater liability protection to a physician's actions in accordance with this section than provided in Article 1B of this Chapter or other applicable provisions of law in this State."
- **SECTION 2.** The North Carolina Medical Board shall adopt temporary rules to implement the provisions of this act.
- **SECTION 3.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the nonrecurring sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to publicize the effects of the provisions of this act to health care providers.
- **SECTION 4.** Section 3 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2022. The remainder of this act becomes effective October 1, 2022.
