11	constitute a lien enforceable by sale of the vessel together with all cargo, tack	
12	as set forth in Chapter 44A of the General Statutes. Proceeds remaining after s	
13	lien, if any, shall be deposited into the Waterway Safety and Access Fur	nd established by
