In order to qualify for the 12 exemption provided under this subsection, the person shall have valid documentation of their 13 service on his or her person at all times during the fishing activity." 14 **SECTION 5.(b)** This section becomes effective October 1, 2021. 15 WATERFOWL HUNTING PUBLIC PROPERTY 16 17 SECTION 6.(a) Section 1 of S.L. 2019-98 reads as rewritten: 18 "SECTION 1. During the waterfowl seasons established by the Wildlife Resources 19 Commission, it shall be unlawful to leave do any of the following: 20 (1)Leave or place any equipment or vessels that may be used for the purpose of 21 taking migratory waterfowl, including, but not limited to, mobile or temporary 22 blinds, layout boats, and decoys between two hours after sunset and 4:00 A.M. 23 each day unless remaining on a portion of the shoreline or attached to a dock 24 as authorized by the owner of the shoreline or dock. 25 Leave unattended or unoccupied any equipment or vessels that may be used (2)26 for the purpose of taking migratory waterfowl, including, but not limited to, mobile or temporary blinds, layout boats, and decoys, prior to 4:00 A.M. 27 28 decoys between 4:00 A.M. and two hours after sunset each day. All such 29 unattended equipment and unoccupied vessels must be removed by two hours 30 after sunset each day unless remaining on a portion of the shoreline or attached 31 to a dock as authorized by the owner of the shoreline or dock." 32 SECTION 6.(b) This section applies only to Roanoke Rapids Lake in Halifax and 33 Northampton Counties. 34 **SECTION 6.(c)** This section is effective when it becomes law and applies to offenses 35 committed on or after that date. 36 37 PREPARATION FOR CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE 38 SECTION 7.(a) Article 12 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended by 39 adding a new section to read: 40 "§ 143-254.7. Appropriation and emergency power to combat Chronic Wasting Disease. If the Commission determines that an outbreak of Chronic Wasting Disease in the State 41 42 constitutes a significant threat to deer and other cervid species, the Commission may declare a 43 wildlife emergency. Upon declaration of the wildlife emergency, the Commission shall request 44 needed additional funding for immediate investigation, containment, and eradication of the outbreak from the Contingency and Emergency Fund to the Council of State for approval 45 following the process set forth in G.S. 143C-4-4(c). The approved funds will be allocated by the 46 47 State Controller to a special fund called the Chronic Wasting Disease Emergency Response Fund 48 (CWD Response Fund). Funds allocated to the CWD Response Fund are appropriated to the Wildlife Resources Commission for the purposes for which the funds are requested and approved. 49 50 The Commission shall request any federal funds available to combat Chronic Wasting Disease in cervids, and any such funds obtained will be used to offset State funds appropriated under this 51

"(g) Controlled Hunting Preserve Operator License. – The Wildlife Resource	S
Commission is authorized by rule to set standards for and to license the operation of controlled	
hunting preserves operated by private persons. Controlled hunting preserves are of three types	
one is an area marked with appropriate signs along the outside boundaries on which only	
domestically raised chukars, Hungarian partridges, and game birds other than wild turkeys are	Э
taken; one is an area enclosed with a dog-proof fence on which rabbits may be hunted with dog	
only; and one is an area enclosed with a dog-proof fence on which foxes and coyotes may be	
hunted with dogs only. A controlled fox and coyote hunting preserve operated for private use	
may be of any size; a controlled hunting preserve operated for commercial purposes shall be an	
area of not less than 500 acres or of such size as set by regulation of the Wildlife Resource	
Commission, which shall take into account differences in terrain and topography, as well as the	9
welfare of the wildlife.	-
Operators of controlled fox hunting preserves may purchase live foxes and coyotes from	
licensed trappers who live-trap foxes and coyotes during any open season for trapping them and may, at any time, take live foxes from their preserves for sale to other licensed operators. The	
controlled hunting preserve operator license for domestically raised birds, foxes, and coyote	
may be purchased for a fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and (\$100.00). The controlled	
hunting preserve operator license for rabbits may be purchased for a fee of twenty-five dollar	
(\$25.00). The controlled hunting preserve operator license is an annual license issued beginning	
1 July each year running until the following 30 June."	2
UNLAWFUL BAITING CLARIFICATION	
SECTION 9A.(a) G.S. 113-295 reads as rewritten:	
'§ 113-295. Unlawful harassment of persons taking wildlife resources.	
(a) It is unlawful for a person to interfere intentionally with the lawful taking of wildlife	Э
resources or to drive, harass, or intentionally disturb any wildlife resources for the purpose o	
disrupting the lawful taking of wildlife resources. It is unlawful to take or abuse property	
equipment, or hunting dogs that are being used for the lawful taking of wildlife resources. This	
subsection does not apply to a person who incidentally interferes with the taking of wildlife	
resources while using the land for other lawful activity such as agriculture, mining, or recreation	•
This subsection also does not apply to activity by a person on land he owns or leases.	

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1	Violation of this subsection is a Class 2 misdemeanor for a first conviction and a	Class 1
2	misdemeanor for a second or subsequent conviction.	
3	(a1) It is unlawful to use an unmanned aircraft system, as defined in G.S. 15A-3	300.1, to
