requirements for instructional days or instructional time. For purposes of this subsection, subdivision, the term "good cause" means that schools in any local school administrative unit in a county have been closed eight days per year during any four of the last 10 years because of severe weather conditions, energy shortages, power failures, or other emergency situations.

 A local board may revise the scheduled closing date if necessary in order to comply with the minimum requirements for instructional days or instructional time.

The required opening and closing dates under this subsection shall not apply to any school that a local board designated as having a modified calendar for the 2003-2004 school year or to any school that was part of a planned program in the 2003-2004 school year for a system of modified calendar schools, so long as the school operates under a modified calendar."

SECTION 2. This act applies only to Rockingham County Schools, Stokes County Schools, Surry County Schools, and Union County Public Schools.

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with the 2021-2022 school year.
