1 SECTION 3. The Commission for Public Health shall adopt temporary and 2 permanent rules to implement this act. 3 SECTION 4. Nothing in this act, or in rules adopted pursuant to Section 3 of this 4 act, shall be construed to alter or amend requirements applicable to public water systems, as that 5 term is defined under G.S. 130A-313, under (i) Article 10 of this Chapter and rules adopted thereunder, (ii) the federal Safe Drinking Water Act, and (iii) the United States Environmental 6 7 Protection Agency's Lead and Copper Rule under 40 C.F.R. Part 141, Subpart I. 8 **SECTION 5**. This act becomes effective on December 1, 2021.
