| A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO CLARIFY ACCREDITATION REQUIREMENTS FOR BENNETT COLLEGE FOR THE NEED-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS FOR STUDENTS ATTENDING PRIVAT INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. G.S. 116-280(3) reads as rewritten: "(3) Eligible private postsecondary institution. — A school that is any of the following: a. A nonprofit postsecondary educational institution with a materian permanent campus located in this State that is not owned or operated by the State of North Carolina or by an agency or political subdivision of the State or by any combination thereof that satisfies all of the following: 1. Is either (i) accredited by the Southern Association of College and Schools under the standards of the College Delega Assembly of the Association Commission on College (SACSCOC) or by the New England Association of School and Colleges through its Commission on Institutions—of High Education. Education or (ii) was accredited by SACSCOC of January 1, 2021, and, beginning January 1, 2021, was member of the Transnational Association of Christian College and Schools. 2. Awards a postsecondary degree as defined in G.S. 116-15. b.
