2	AN ACT TO REVISE THE STUDENTS WITH LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY				
3	ALLOTMENT, TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO STUDY THE				
4	STUDENTS WITH LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY ALLOTMENT, AND TO				
5	APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE STUDENTS WITH LIMITED ENGLISH				
6	PROFICIENCY ALLOTMENT.				
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:				
8	<b>SECTION 1.(a)</b> For the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, the State Board of Education				
9	shall develop guidelines for identifying and providing services to students with limited				
10	proficiency in the English language, as follows:				
11	(1) The State Board of Education shall allocate these funds to local school				
12	administrative units and to charter schools under a formula that takes into				
13	account the average percentage of students in the units or the charters over the				
14	past three years who have limited English proficiency. The State Board of				
15	Education shall allocate funds to a unit or a charter school only if (i) average				
16	daily membership of the unit or the charter school includes at least 20 students				
17	with limited English proficiency or (ii) students with limited English				
18	proficiency comprise at least two and one-half percent (2.5%) of the average				
19	daily membership of the unit or charter school. For the portion of the funds				
20	that is allocated on the basis of the number of identified students, the State				
21	Board of Education shall not set a maximum number or percentage of				
22	identified students for whom a unit or charter school may receive funds.				
23	(2) Local school administrative units shall use funds allocated to them to pay for				
24	classroom teachers, teacher assistants, tutors, textbooks, classroom				
25	materials/instructional supplies/equipment, transportation costs, and staff				
26	development of teachers for students with limited English proficiency.				
27	(3) A county in which a local school administrative unit receives funds under this				
28	section shall use the funds to supplement local current expense funds and shall				
29	not supplant local current expense funds.				
30	<b>SECTION 1.(b)</b> The Department of Public Instruction shall prepare a current head				
31	count of the number of students classified with limited English proficiency by December 1 of				
32	each year. Students in the head count shall be assessed at least once every three years to determine				
33	their level of English proficiency

34 SECTION 2. The State Board of Education shall study the allotment for students 35 with limited English proficiency (LEP), as enacted by Section 1 of this act. No later than 36 December 31, 2021, the State Board of Education shall report the results of its study to the Joint
