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| 2  | AN ACT PROTECTING THE RELIGIOUS RIGHTS OF HOSPITAL PATIENTS BY                                      |
| 3  | PRESERVING THEIR RIGHT TO RECEIVE VISITS BY CLERGY MEMBERS DURING                                   |
| 4  | HOSPITAL STAYS THAT OCCUR DURING A DECLARED DISASTER OR   |
| 5  | EMERGENCY.  |
| 6  | The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  |
| 7  | <b>SECTION 1.</b> Part 2 of Article 5 of Chapter 131E of the General Statutes is amended            |
| 8  | by adding a new section to read:  |
| 9  | "§ 131E-84.05. Patient visitation by clergy, including during declared disasters or                 |
| 10 | emergencies.  |
| 11 | Notwithstanding G.S. 131E-84, Chapter 166A of the General Statutes, or any other provision          |
| 12 | of law to the contrary, each hospital licensed under this Article shall allow a clergy member to    |
| 13 | visit any patient admitted to the hospital who requests or consents to be visited by a clergy       |
| 14 | member during the patient's hospital stay, including a hospital stay that occurs during a declared  |
| 15 | disaster or emergency. A hospital may require a visiting clergy member to submit to health          |
| 16 | screenings necessary to prevent the spread of infectious diseases, and, notwithstanding anything    |
| 17 | to the contrary in this section, a hospital may restrict a visiting clergy member who does not pass |
| 18 | a health screening requirement or who has tested positive for an infectious disease. A hospital     |
| 19 | may require a visiting clergy member to adhere to infection control procedures, including           |
| 20 | wearing personal protective equipment, as long as the infection control procedures do not           |
| 21 | interfere with the religious beliefs of the patient or the visiting clergy member."                 |
| 22 | <b>SECTION 2.</b> This act becomes effective October 1, 2021.                                       |
