2	AN ACT PROTECTING THE RELIGIOUS RIGHTS OF HOSPITAL PATIENTS BY			
3	PRESERVING THEIR RIGHT TO RECEIVE VISITS BY CLERGY MEMBERS DURING			
4	HOSPITAL STAYS THAT OCCUR DURING A DECLARED DISASTER OR			
5	EMERGENCY.			
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
7	SECTION 1. Part 2 of Article 5 of Chapter 131E of the General Statutes is amended			
8	by adding a new section to read:			
9	"§ 131E-84.05. Patient visitation by clergy, including during declared disasters or			
10		mergencies.		
11	Notwithstanding G.S. 131E-84, Chapter 166A of the General Statutes, or any other provision			
12	of law to the contrary, each hospital licensed under this Article shall allow a clergy member to			
13	visit any patient admitted to the hospital who requests or consents to be visited by a clergy			
14	member during the patient's hospital stay, including a hospital stay that occurs during a declared			
15	disaster or emergency. A hospital may require a visiting clergy member to submit to health			
16	screenings necessary to prevent the spread of infectious diseases, and, notwithstanding anything			
17	to the contrary in this section, a hospital may restrict a visiting clergy member who does not pass			
18	a health screening requirement or who has tested positive for an infectious disease. A hospital			
19	may require a visiting clergy member to adhere to infection control procedures, including			
20	wearing personal protective equipment, as long as the infection control procedures do not			
21	interfere with	interfere with the religious beliefs of the patient or the visiting clergy member "		

21 interfere with the religious beliefs of the patient or the visiting clergy member." 22 SECTION 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 2021.



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
