5	SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-218.3 reads as rewritten:				
6	"§ 115C-218.3. Fast-track replication of high-quality charter schools.				
7	Upon recommendations by the Office of Charter Schools and the Charter Schools Advisory				
8	Board, the State Board of Education shall adopt a process and rules for fast-track replication of				
9	high-quality charter schools currently operating in the State. The State Board of Education shall				
10	not require a planning year for applicants selected through the fast-track replication process. In				
11	addition to the requirements for charter applicants set forth in this Article, the fast-track				
12	replication process adopted by the State Board of Education shall, at a minimum, require a board				
13	of directors of a charter school to demonstrate one of the following in order to qualify for				
14	fast-track replication:

The State Board of Education shall ensure that the rules for a fast-track replication process provide that decisions by the State Board of Education on whether to grant a charter through the



- 1 replication process are completed in less than 120 days from the application submission date.
- 2 The State Board shall provide a decision no later than October 15 of the year immediately 3 preceding the year of the proposed school opening."
- 4 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to applications 5 for fast-track replication of charter schools submitted on or after that date.
