SECTION 3. Part 2 of Article 6 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 130A-157.5. Rights of individuals who refuse COVID-19 vaccines.



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Notwithstanding any provision of this Article or any other provision of law to the contrary, any legal resident of this or another state who chooses not to take any of the coronavirus vaccines approved for emergency use or otherwise by the United States Food and Drug Administration has the same right as an individual who chooses to take any such vaccine to the full and free use of buildings and land owned, leased, or otherwise controlled by the State of North Carolina or any of its political subdivisions, including schools, colleges, and universities."

SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
