1	(2) Modification by super majority vote. – The General Assembly may vote to increase			
2	the fiscal year spending limit established under this Section. An increase in the fiscal year			
	spending limit must be approved by a two-thirds majority of the members of each house of the			
	General Assembly."			
	SECTION 2. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act shall be submitted to			
	the qualified voters of the State at the general election in 2022, which election shall be conducted			
	under the laws then governing elections in the State. Ballots, voting systems, or both may be used			
	in accordance with Chapter 163 of the General Statutes. The question to be used in the voting			
	systems and ballots shall be:			
	"[] FOR [] AGAINST			
	Constitutional amendment limiting the annual growth of the State budget to a			
	percentage equal to the sum of annual inflation and the State's annual population growth rate			
	unless increased in a year in which two-thirds of both chambers of the General Assembly votes			
	in favor of the increase."			
	<b>SECTION 3.</b> If a majority of votes cast on the question are in favor of the amendment			
	set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the amendment to the			
	Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall enroll the amendment so certified among the			
	permanent records of that office. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act becomes			
	effective upon certification and applies to fiscal years beginning on or after that date.			
	SECTION 4. Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes			
	law.
