	ECTION 1.(b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to DMH the su	
six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2021-2022 fiscal year to		
be used to pay the contracted vendor for currently unfunded costs accrued by that vendor's		
continuation of the TBI pilot program during the 2019-2021 biennium. There is appropriated		
from the General Fund to DMH the sum of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) in		
nonrecurring funds for the 2021-2022 fiscal year and three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2022-2023 fiscal year to be used for the TBI pilot program.		
SECTION 1.(c) No later than April 1, 2022, DMH shall submit a report on the TBI
