14		<u>a.</u> <u>Will potentially be admitted to, or receive services from, a treatment</u>
15		facility or recovery residence.
16		b. Is admitted to, or receiving services from, a treatment facility or
17		recovery residence.
18		<u>c.</u> <u>Has been admitted to, or received services from, a treatment facility or</u>
19		recovery residence.
20	<u>(2)</u>	Recovery residence An unlicensed shared living environment that is
21		intended to be free from alcohol and illicit drug use and centered on peer
22		support and connection to services that promote sustained recovery from
23		substance use disorders.
24	<u>(3)</u>	Referral. – A person or entity shall be considered to have made a referral if
25		the provider or operator of a recovery residence has provided, by any means,
26		the name, address, or other identifying information for a treatment facility or
27		recovery residence to a patient.
