10	encouraged to report verbally or in writing to the State Health Plan, Attorney General, or other			
11	appropriate authority evidence of activity related to the State Health Plan and involving the			
12	following:			
13	(1	) A violation of State or federal law, rule, or regulation.

21	Treasurer may adopt rules to assist in the identification and investigation of activities described			
22	under subsect	under subsection (a) of this section undertaken by a health care provider that provides services		
23	to Plan members. If the Plan adopts a program to encourage its members to report these activities,			
24	then the Plan is authorized to expend State funds in furtherance of the policy objectives of this			
25	section and may adopt rules to offer an incentive to Plan members of up to two percent (2%) of			
26	any net recovery made by the Plan resulting from the member report.
