| 6 | Whereas, the Murchison Road corridor in Fayetteville is rich and plentiful in African |

7 American history; and

8 Whereas, an investment is needed to assist in retaining the history for future 9 generations; Now, therefore,

10 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Orange Street 11 School Restoration and Historical Association, Inc., a nonprofit organization, the sum of two 12 hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2021-2022 fiscal year to 13 support the Association's efforts to renovate the school building and further develop the Orange 14 Street neighborhood. The 1915 historic Orange Street School building is listed on the National 15 Register of Historic Places and is Fayetteville's oldest surviving building used for education. 16

17 SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Umoja Group, Inc., a nonprofit organization, the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) in 18 nonrecurring funds for the 2021-2022 fiscal year to support the African American pictorial wall 19 20 to allow digitalization of the wall's images and content, as well as the preservation of the wall. Umoja Group, Inc., is an educational, cultural, charitable, and service organization that initiates 21 22 and supports activities that promote the positive history, arts, and culture of Africans and African 23 Americans and shares this rich heritage with others to enhance respect, cooperation, and unity. 24

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2021.
