

7	SECT	<b>ION 1.(a)</b> G.S. 143-215.3(a) reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 143-215.3. Ge	eneral powers of Commission and Department; auxiliary powers.
9	(a) Additi	onal Powers In addition to the specific powers prescribed elsewhere in this
10	Article, and for th	e purpose of carrying out its duties, the Commission shall have the power:

12	(9)	If an investigation conducted pursuant to this Article or Article 21B of this
13		Chapter reveals a violation of any rules, standards, or limitations adopted by
14		the Commission pursuant to this Article or Article 21B of this Chapter, or a
15		violation of any terms or conditions of any permit issued pursuant to
16		G.S. 143-215.1 or 143-215.108, or special order or other document issued
17		pursuant to G.S. 143-215.2 or G.S. 143-215.110, the Commission may assess
18		the reasonable costs of any investigation, inspection or monitoring survey
19		which revealed the violation against the person responsible therefor. If the
20		violation resulted in an unauthorized discharge to the waters or atmosphere of
21		the State, the Commission may also assess the person responsible for the
22		violation for any actual and necessary costs incurred by the State in removing,
23		correcting or abating any adverse effects upon the water or air resulting from
24		the unauthorized discharge. If the person responsible for the violation refuses
25		or fails within a reasonable time to pay any sums assessed, the Commission
26		may institute a civil action in the superior court of the county in which the
27		violation occurred or, in the Commission's discretion, in the superior court of
28		the county in which such person resides or has his or its principal place of
29		business, to recover such sums.

31	(12)	To declare an emergency when it finds that a generalized condition of water
32		or air pollution which is causing imminent danger to the health or safety of
33		the public. Regardless of any other provisions of law, if the Department finds
34 25		that such a condition of water or air pollution exists and that it creates an
35		emergency requiring immediate action to protect the public health and safety
36		or to protect fish and wildlife, the Secretary of the Department with the



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1		concurrence of the Governor, shall order persons causing or contributing to
2		the water or air pollution in question to reduce or discontinue immediately the
3		emission of air contaminants or the discharge of wastes. Immediately after the
4		issuance of such order, the chairman of the Commission shall fix a place and
5		time for a hearing before the Commission to be held within 24 hours after
6		issuance of such order, and within 24 hours after the commencement of such
7		hearing, and without adjournment thereof, the Commission shall either affirm,
8		modify or set aside the order.
9		In the absence of a generalized condition of air or water pollution of the
10		type referred to above, if the Secretary finds that the emissions from one or
11		more air contaminant sources or the discharge of wastes from one or more
12		sources of water pollution is causing imminent danger to human health and
12		safety or to fish and wildlife, he may with the concurrence of the Governor
13		order the person or persons responsible for the operation or operations in
15		question to immediately reduce or discontinue the emissions of air
15		contaminants or the discharge of wastes or to take such other measures as are,
10		in his judgment, necessary, without regard to any other provisions of this

18 19		Article or Article 21B of this Chapter. In such event, the requirements for
		hearing and affirmance, modification or setting aside of such orders set forth
20 21	(10 - )	in the preceding paragraph of this subdivision shall apply.

22 23		Chapter reveals a condition of water or air pollution which is causing danger
23 24		to the health or safety of the public, the Secretary of the Department may order
24 25		persons causing or contributing to the water or air pollution in question to immediately reduce or discontinue the emissions of air contaminants or the
23 26		discharge of wastes or to take such other measures as are necessary, in the
20 27		Secretary's judgment, without regard to any other provisions of this Article or
27		Article 21B of this Chapter. The order may direct the person to take, or refrain
28 29		from taking, an action, or to achieve a result, within a period of time specified
30		by the order, as the Secretary deems necessary and feasible in order to alleviate
31		or eliminate the pollution. In addition, the order may require the person to
32		provide alternate water supplies to persons with water supplies damaged by
32 33		the water or air pollution in question, or require the person to establish a
33 34		permanent replacement water supply to persons with water supplies damaged
34 35		by the water or air pollution in question, as appropriate in the judgment of the
35 36		Secretary. In the case of a permanent replacement water supply, the water
30 37		supply shall be established by connection to a public water supply, except that
38		an affected household may elect to receive a whole house filtration system in
38 39		lieu of a connection to a public water supply, in which case the person
40		responsible shall install a filtration system. For households for which filtration
40 41		systems are installed, the person responsible shall be liable for any periodic
42		required maintenance of the filtration system. The Secretary shall assess the
43		person causing or contributing to the water or air pollution in question for any
43 44		actual and necessary costs incurred by the State in removing, correcting, or
44		actual and necessary costs incurred by the state in removing, correcting, or abating any adverse effects upon the water or air resulting from the water or
45 46		air pollution for which the person is responsible. If the person responsible for
40 47		the water or air pollution in question refuses or fails within a reasonable time
48		to pay any sums assessed, the Secretary may institute a civil action in the
49		superior court of the county in which the water or air pollution occurred or, in
50		the Secretary's discretion, in the superior court of the county in which such
51		person resides or has its principal place of business to recover such sums.

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2	SECTION 1.(b) G.S. 143-215.2(a) reads as rewritten:
3	"§ 143-215.2. Special orders.
4	(a) Issuance. – The Commission may, after the effective date of classifications, standards
5	and limitations adopted pursuant to G.S. 143-214.1 or G.S. 143-215, or a water supply watershed
6	management requirement adopted pursuant to G.S. 143-214.5, issue, and from time to time
7	modify or revoke, a special order, or other appropriate instrument, to any person whom it finds
8	responsible for causing or contributing to any pollution of the waters of the State within the area
9	for which standards have been established. The order or instrument may direct the person to take,
10	or refrain from taking an action, or to achieve a result, within a period of time specified by the
11	special order, as the Commission deems necessary and feasible in order to alleviate or eliminate
12	the pollution. pollution, including a requirement that the responsible person provide temporary
13	alternate or permanent replacement water supplies to persons with water supplies damaged by
14	the water pollution in question. The Commission is authorized to enter into consent special
15	orders, assurances of voluntary compliance or other similar documents by agreement with the
16	person responsible for pollution of the water, subject to the provisions of subsection (a1) of this
17	section regarding proposed orders, and the consent order, when entered into by the Commission
18	after public review, shall have the same force and effect as a special order of the Commission
19	issued pursuant to hearing."
20	SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
21	Environmental Quality the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) in recurring funds for
22	the 2021-2022 fiscal year to implement the requirements of this act.
23	<b>SECTION 3.</b> The provisions of G.S. 143C-5-2 do not apply to this act.
24	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
