OF PUBLIC HEALTH, TO RAISE PUBLIC AWARENESS ABOUT THIS AGE

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
SECTION 1. G.S. 130A-412.31 reads as rewritten:		
"§ 130A-412.31. Giving of blood by persons 16 18 years of age or more.		
-	who is 16- 18 years of age or more may give or donate blood to a	
hospital, blood bank or blood collection center without the consent of the parent or parents or		
guardian of the donor. It shall be unlawful for a person under the age of 18 years to sell blood."		
	ECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the D	-
Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)		
in nonrecurring funds for the 2022-2023 fiscal year to raise public awareness about the age		
•	specified in G.S. 130A-412.31, as amended by this act, to give or do	nate blood in
this State wit	thout parental consent.	

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2022.
