5	Provided, that if the criminal pleading alleges that the violation was committed intentionally, and
6	upon trial it is specifically found that the violation was committed intentionally, such violations
7	shall be a Class I felony unless one of the following applies:

9	(1a) <u>A person who violates subdivision (12a) of subsection (a) of this section shall</u>
10	be punished as a Class E felon.
