35	Authority (Authority) for administrative costs in establishing the Community College Promise				
36	Scholarship Program and the financial aid counseling program pursuant to Part 7 of Article 23				
37	of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes, as enacted by this act. There is appropriated from the				
38	General Fund to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of two				
39	hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000) in recurring funds for the 2024-2025 fiscal year to be				
40	allocated to the Authority for the purpose of awarding scholarships and for the financial aid				
41	counseling program under the Community College Promise Scholarship Program pursuant to
