A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO CHANGE THE LIMITATIONS PERIOD FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE
CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS AND EXPENDITURES LAWS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 163-278.27(a) reads as rewritten:

"(a) Any individual, candidate, political committee, referendum committee, treasurer, person or media who violates the provisions of G.S. 163-278.7, 163-278.8, 163-278.9, 163-278.10, 163-278.11, 163-278.12, 163-278.14, 163-278.16, 163-278.17, 163-278.18, 163-278.40A, 163-278.40B, 163-278.40C, 163-278.40D or 163-278.40E is guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no prosecution for a misdemeanor violation brought under this section or any other section of this Article shall be barred before the expiration of five years after the date of the violation."

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective January 1, 1995, and applies to all violations committed on or after that date.
