41 42 officer or employee, shall be deemed thereupon shall be considered to resign from his or her-membership on the Board of Trustees. This subsection does not apply to ex officio members.

- (d) Members appointed under subdivisions (1) or (2) of subsection (a) of this section shall serve four-year terms. Eight of those terms shall expire June 30, 1993, and quadrennially thereafter, and eight of those terms shall expire June 30, 1995, and quadrennially thereafter. Only an ex officio member shall be eligible to serve more than two successive terms. Any vacancy in the membership of the Board of Trustees appointed under G.S. 116-233(a)(1) or (2) shall be reported promptly by the Secretary of the Board of Trustees to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina, which shall fill any such vacancy by appointment of a replacement member to serve for the balance of the unexpired term. Any vacancy in members appointed under G.S. 116-233(a)(5) or (6) shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 120-122. Any vacancy in members appointed under G.S. 116-233(a)(7) shall be filled by the Governor for the remainder of the unexpired term. Reapportionment of congressional districts does not affect the right of any member to complete the term for which the member was appointed. Four of the initial class of members of the Board of Trustees appointed under G.S. 116-233(a) by the Governor shall each be chosen for a term of one year to end June 30, 1995: four shall each be chosen for a term of three years to end June 30, 1997; and four shall each be chosen for a term of four years to end June 30, 1998. The two members of the initial class appointed by the General Assembly shall be chosen to serve four-year terms. Any vacancy in the membership of the Board of Trustees appointed under G.S. 116-233(a) shall be reported promptly by the Secretary of the Board of Trustees to the appointing officeholder or body responsible for appointment of the position vacated. That officeholder or body shall fill the vacancy by appointing an appropriate replacement to serve for the balance of the unexpired term.
- (e) Of the initial members appointed under G.S. 116-233[(a)](5), one member shall serve a term to expire June 30, 1987, and one member shall serve a term to expire June 30, 1989. Subsequent appointments shall be for four-year terms. The initial members appointed under G.S. 116-233[(a)](6), shall be appointed for terms to expire June 30, 1987. Subsequent appointments shall be for two-year terms. The initial members appointed under G.S. 116-233[(a)](7) shall be appointed for terms to expire January 15, 1989. Successors shall be appointed for four-year terms.
- (f) Whenever an appointed member of the Board of Trustees shall fail, for any reason other than ill health or service in the interest of the State or nation, to be present at three successive regular meetings of the Board, his or her that member's place as a member of the Board shall be deemed vacant."

Sec. 2. G.S. 116-234 reads as rewritten:

## "§ 116-234. Board of Trustees; meetings; rules of procedure; officers.

(a) The Board of Trustees shall meet at least four times a year and may hold special meetings at any time, at the call of the chairman or upon petition addressed to the chairman-chair by at least four of the members of the Board.

- (b) The Board of Trustees shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman; no ex officio member may hold such an office. The Governor shall appoint the chair and the vice-chair of the Board of Trustees upon recommendation by the members of the Board. 4
  - The Board of Trustees shall determine its own rules of procedure and may delegate to such any committees as it may create such of its powers as it deems considers appropriate.
  - (d) Members of the Board of Trustees, other than ex officio members under G.S. 116-233[(a)](3). Trustees shall receive such the per diem compensation and necessary travel and subsistence expenses while engaged in the discharge of their official duties as that is provided by law for members of State boards and commissions. Ex officio members under G.S. 116-233[(a)](3) shall be reimbursed for travel expenses as provided by G.S. 138-6. (1985, c. 757, s. 206(b).)"
    - Sec. 3. G.S. 116-237 is repealed.
  - There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Sec. 4. Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 1994-95 fiscal year, for the Board of Trustees of the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics, to implement this act.
    - Sec. 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 1994.
