1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION OF THE PRACTICE OF
3	COUNSELING AND THE LICENSURE OF COUNSELORS.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. Article 24 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes reads as rewritten:
6	"ARTICLE 24.
7	" registered practicing, <u>LICENSED PROFESSIONAL</u> COUNSELORS
8	<u>ACT.</u>
9	"§ 90-329. Declaration of policy.
10	It is declared to be the public policy of this State that the activities of persons using
11	the title 'Registered Practicing Counselor'-who render counseling services to the public be
12	regulated to insure the protection of the public health, safety safety, and welfare.
13	"§ 90-330. Definitions; practice of law; practice of marriage and family therapy.
14	(a) Definitions. <u>–</u> As used in this Article certain terms are defined as follows:
15	(1) A 'counselor' is a person engaged in the practice of counseling who is
16	not a Registered Practicing Counselor as defined in this Article.
17	(1a) The 'Board' means the Board of Licensed Professional Counselors.
18	(2) A 'Registered Practicing Counselor'-'licensed professional counselor' is a
19	person engaged in the practice of counseling who holds a certificate

1		license as a Registered Practicing Counselor licensed professional
2		counselor issued to him under the provisions of this Article.
3	(3)	The 'practice of counseling' means holding oneself out to the public as
4		a practicing-professional counselor offering counseling services which
5		that include, but are not limited to to, the following:
6		a. Counseling Assisting an individual, individuals, groups, and
7		families through the counseling relationship, using a
8		combination of clinical mental health and human development
9		principles, methods, diagnostic procedures, treatment plans, and
10		other psychotherapeutic techniques, to develop an
11		understanding of personal problems, to define goals goals, and
12		to plan action reflecting his or her-the client's interests, abilities,
13		aptitudes, and mental health needs as these are related to
14		personal-social personal-social-emotional concerns, education
15		progress-educational progress, and occupations and careers.
16		b. Appraisal Activities. <u>–</u> Administering and interpreting tests for
17		assessment of personal characteristics.
18		c. Consulting. – Interpreting scientific data and providing
19		guidance and personnel services to individuals, groups groups,
20		or organizations.
21		d. Referral Activities Identifying problems requiring referral to
22		other specialists.
23		e. Research Activities Designing, conducting conducting, and
24		interpreting research with human subjects.
25	<u>(4)</u>	A 'supervisor' means any licensed professional counselor or, when one
26		is inaccessible, an equivalently credentialed mental health
27		professional, as determined by the Board, with a minimum of five
28		years of counseling experience who meets the qualifications
29		established by the Board.
30	(b) Practi	ce of Law. Nothing in this Article shall be construed as authorizing
31	Registered Pract	ticing Counselors to engage in the practice of law, and such person shall
32	not engage in th	e practice of law unless duly licensed so to do.
33	(c) Practi	ce of Marriage and Family Therapy, Psychology-Psychology, or Social
34	Work. <u>– No</u> p	erson hereafter registered-licensed as a Practicing Counselor-licensed
35		unselor under the provisions of this Article shall be allowed to hold
36	himself or herse	<u>lf</u> out to the public as having specialized training or experience as an expert

16	<u>(a)</u> <u>It is</u>	not the intent of this Article to regulate members of other regulated
17	-	o do counseling in the normal course of the practice of their profession.
18	Accordingly, th	is Article does not apply to:
19	<u>(1)</u>	Lawyers, doctors licensed under Chapter 90, and any other person
20		registered, certified, or licensed by the State to practice any other
21		occupation or profession while rendering counseling services in the
22		performance of the occupation or profession for which the person is
23		registered, certified, or licensed.
24	<u>(2)</u>	Any school counselor certified by the State Board of Education while
25		counseling within the scope of employment by a board of education or
26		private school.
27	<u>(3)</u>	Any student intern or trainee in counseling pursuing a course of study
28		in counseling in a regionally accredited institution of higher learning
29		or training institution, if the intern or trainee is a designated 'counselor
30		intern' and the activities and services constitute a part of the supervised
31		<u>course of study.</u>
32	<u>(4)</u>	Any ordained minister or other member of the clergy while acting in a
33		ministerial capacity.
34	<u>(5)</u>	Any nonresident temporarily employed in this State to render
35		counseling services for not more than 30 days in a year, if the person
36		holds a license or certificate required for counselors in another state.
37	<u>(6)</u>	Any person employed by State, federal, county, or municipal
38		government while counseling within the scope of employment.
39	<u>(7)</u>	Any person performing mental health counseling solely as an
40		employee of an area facility, as defined in G.S. 122C-3(14)a., if both
41		of the following apply:
42		a. The mental health services are provided by a qualified mental
43		health professional who meets or exceeds the minimum

1	educational qualifications for licensure as a licensed
2	professional counselor under this Article.
3	b. The area facility has obtained written verification from the
4	following boards that the employee has not had his or her
5	license, registration, or certification revoked, rescinded, or
6	suspended: the North Carolina Board of Licensed Professional
7	Counselors, the North Carolina State Board of Examiners of
8	Practicing Psychologists, the North Carolina Certification
9	Board for Social Work, and the North Carolina Marital and
10	Family Therapy Certification Board.
11	(b) Persons who claim to be exempt under subsection (a) of this section are
12	prohibited from advertising or offering themselves as 'licensed professional counselors'.
13	(c) <u>Persons licensed under this Article are exempt from rules pertaining to</u>
14	counseling adopted by other occupational licensing boards.
15	"§ 90-333. North Carolina Board of Registered Practicing-Licensed Professional
16	Counselors; appointments; terms; composition.
17	(a) For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Article, there is hereby
18	created the North Carolina Board of Registered Practicing Licensed Professional
19	Counselors which shall consist of seven members appointed by the Governor in the
20	manner hereinafter prescribed. Any nationally recognized association representing
21	professional counselors may submit recommendations to the Governor for Board
22	membership. The Governor may remove any member of the Board for neglect of duty
23	or malfeasance or conviction of a felony or other crime of moral turpitude, but for no
24	other reason.
25	(b) At least five members of the Board shall be Registered Practicing Counselors
26	licensed professional counselors except that initial appointees shall be persons who
27	meet the educational and experience requirements for registration as Registered Practicing
28	licensure as licensed professional counselors under the provisions of this Article; and
29	two members shall be appointed from the public at large. public-at-large members
30	appointed from the general public. Composition of the Board as to the race and sex of
31	its members shall reflect the composition of the population of the State of North Carolina.
32	State and each member shall reside in a different congressional district.
33	(c) At all times the Board shall include at least two counselors one counselor
34	primarily engaged in counselor education, at least one counselor primarily engaged in
35	the public sector, and at least two counselors one counselor primarily engaged in the
36	private sectorsector, and two licensed professional counselors at large.
37	(d) All members of the Board shall be residents of the State of North Carolina,
38	and after the establishment of the initial Board, all members, and, with the exception of the
39	public members public-at-large members, shall be registered licensed by the Board under
40	the provisions of this Article. Professional members of the Board must be actively
41	engaged in the practice of counseling or in the education and training of students in
42	counseling, and have been for at least three years prior to their appointment to the
43	Board. Such-The engagement in this activity during the two years preceding the
44	appointment shall have occurred primarily in this State.

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1 (e) The term of office of each member of the Board shall be three years; 2 provided, however, that of the members first appointed, three shall be appointed for 3 terms of one year, two for terms of two years, and two for terms of three years. No 4 member shall serve more than two consecutive three-year terms.

5 (f) Each term of service on the Board shall expire on the 30th day of June of the 6 year in which the term expires. As the term of a member expires, the Governor shall 7 make the appointment for a full term, or, if a vacancy occurs for any other reason, for 8 the remainder of the unexpired term.

9 (g) Members of the Board shall receive compensation for their services and 10 reimbursement for expenses incurred in the performance of duties required by this 11 Article, at the rates prescribed in G.S. 93B-5.

12 (h) The Board may employ, subject to the provisions of Chapter 126 of the 13 General Statutes, the necessary personnel for the performance of its functions, and fix 14 their compensation within the limits of funds available to the Board.

15 "§ 90-334. Functions and duties of the Board.

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(a) The Board shall administer and enforce the provisions of this Article.

17 (b) The Board shall elect from its membership, a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, 18 and secretary-treasurer, and adopt rules to govern its proceedings. A majority of the 19 membership shall constitute a quorum for all Board meetings.

(c) The Board shall examine and pass on the qualifications of all applicants for
 certificates-licenses under this Article, and shall issue a certificate-license or renewal of
 license to each successful applicant therefor.

23 (d) The Board may adopt a seal which may be affixed to all certificates licenses
24 issued by the Board.

25 (e) The Board may authorize expenditures deemed necessary to carry out the 26 provisions of this Article from the fees which it collects, but in no event shall 27 expenditures exceed the revenues of the Board during any fiscal year. No State 28 appropriations shall be subject to the administration of the Board.

(f) The Board shall establish and receive fees not to exceed seventy five dollars (\$75.00) one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for initial or renewal application, not to exceed seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for examination, and not to exceed fifteen dollars (\$15.00) twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for late renewal; renewal, maintain Board accounts of all receipts, and make expenditures from Board receipts for any purpose which is reasonable and necessary for the proper performance of its duties under this Article.

36 (g) The Board shall have the power to establish or approve study or training 37 courses and to establish reasonable standards for <u>registration-licensure</u> and <u>certificate</u> 38 <u>license</u> renewal, including but not limited to the power to adopt or use examination 39 materials and accreditation standards of any recognized counselor accrediting agency 40 and the power to establish reasonable standards for continuing counselor education; 41 provided that for certificate renewal no examination shall be required.-<u>education.</u>

42 (h) Subject to the provisions of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes, the Board 43 shall have the power to adopt, amend, or repeal rules and regulations-to carry out the

1	purposes of this Article, including but not limited to the power to adopt ethical and
2	disciplinary standards.
3	(i) The Board shall not adopt rules to regulate individuals who do not use the title
4	'Registered Practicing Counselor.' The Board shall establish the criteria for determining the
5	qualifications constituting 'supervised professional practice'.
6	(j) The Board may examine counselor applicants, approve, issue, deny, revoke,
7	suspend, and renew the licenses of counselor applicants and licensees under this Article,
8	and conduct hearings in connection with these actions.
9	(k) The Board shall investigate, subpoena individuals and records, and take
10	necessary appropriate action to properly discipline persons licensed under this Article
11	and to enforce this Article.
12	"§ 90-335. Board general provisions.
13	The Board shall be subject to the provisions of Chapter 93B of the General Statutes.
14	"§ 90-336. Title and qualifications for registration. <u>licensure.</u>
15	(a) Each person desiring to be registered by the Board- <u>a licensed professional</u>
16	counselor shall make application to the Board upon such forms and in such manner as
17	the Board shall prescribe, together with the required application fee established by the
18	Board. fee.
19 20	(b) The Board shall issue a certificate as 'Registered Practicing Counselor' license as
20	<u>'licensed professional counselor'</u> to an applicant who: who meets all of the following
21 22	<u>criteria:</u> (1) Has carried one of the following:
22 23	(1) <u>Has earned one of the following:</u>
23 24	a. <u>A masters degree in counseling from a regionally accredited</u> institution of higher education, which includes a minimum of
24 25	48 semester hours.
23 26	Holds a Master's degree from a college or university accredited by one
20 27	of the regional accrediting associations or from a college or university
28	determined by the Board to have standards substantially equivalent to
20 29	a regionally accredited institution, and
30	(2) Has a
31	b. <u>A graduate degree in a related field including a concentration in</u>
32	subject matter directly related to the practice of counseling as
33	defined in G.S. 90-330(a)(3) or a degree supplemented with
34	courses that the Board determines to be substantially equivalent,
35	and equivalent.
36	(3) (2) Provides satisfactory evidence of the completion of two years'
37	experience in the practice of counseling under the direct supervision
38	of a Registered Practicing Counselor. A doctoral degree in
39	counseling from an accredited college or university may be
40	substituted for two years of experience. Has had no less than two
41	years of masters or post-masters counseling experience, or of both,
42	in a professional setting, including a minimum of 2,000 hours of
43	supervised professional practice as defined by the Board.
44	(3) Has passed an examination as adopted by the Board.

1	"§ 90-337. Persons certified credentialed in other states.
2	A counselor who holds a valid and unrevoked certificate as a Registered Practicing
2	Counselor, or its equivalent, issued under authority of any state, or the District of
4	Columbia, and who resides within the State of North Carolina, may perform work
5	within the State: Provided, that he register with the State Board of Registered Practicing
6	Counselors and comply with its rules regarding such registration. Such person may use
7	the term 'Counselor' in connection with his name, but may not use the term 'Registered
8	Practicing Counselor' without registering with the Board. The Board may license any
8 9	person who is currently licensed, certified, or registered by another state if the
10	individual has met requirements determined by the Board to be substantially similar to
11	or exceeding those established under this Article.
12	"§ 90-338. Temporary exemption from academic qualifications. Exemptions.
13	Applicants holding certificates of registration as Registered Practicing Counselors
14	and in good standing with the Board shall be issued licenses as licensed professional
15	counselors without meeting the requirements of G.S. 90-336(b). Applicants who were
16	engaged in the practice of counseling before January 1, 1984, The following applicants shall
17	be exempt from the academic qualifications required by this Article for Registered
18	Practicing Counselors licensed professional counselors and shall be registered licensed
19	upon passing the Board examination and meeting the experience requirements.
20	requirements:
21	(1) An applicant who was engaged in the practice of counseling before
22	<u>July 1, 1993.</u>
23	(2) An applicant who holds a masters degree from a college or university
24	accredited by one of the regional accrediting associations or from a
25	college or university determined by the Board to have standards
26	substantially equivalent to a regionally accredited institution, provided
27	the applicant was enrolled in the masters program prior to July 1,
28	<u>1994.</u>
29	"§ 90-339. Renewal of certificates of registration. <u>licenses.</u>
30	(a) All <u>certificates of registration licenses</u> shall be effective upon <u>the</u> date of
31	issuance by the Board, and shall expire on the second June 30 thereafter.
32	(b) All certificates of registration licenses issued hereunder shall be renewed at the
33	times and in the manner provided by this section. At least 45 days prior to expiration of
34	each certificate of registration, license, the Board shall mail a notice for certificate license
35	renewal to the person certified-licensed for the current certification-licensure period. At
36	least 10 days before the current certificate license expires, the applicant must return the
37	notice properly completed, together with a renewal fee established by the Board, Board
38	and evidence of continuing counselor education as approved by the Board, upon receipt
39	of which the Board shall issue to the person to be registered licensed the renewed
40	certificate of registration license for the period stated on the said certificate. license.
41	(c) Any person <u>certified-licensed</u> who allows <u>his certificate the license</u> to lapse for
42	failure to apply for renewal within 45 days after notice shall be subject to a the late
43	renewal fee as established hereinfee. Failure to apply for renewal of a certificate of
44	registration-license within one year after the certificate's-license's expiration date will

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1	require that a certificate of registration license be reissued only upon application as for an
2	original certificate. <u>license.</u>
3	"§ 90-340. Disciplinary procedures. <u>Protection of the public.</u>
4	The Board may, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 150B of the General
5	Statutes, refuse to grant or to renew, may suspend, or may revoke the certificate-license
6	of any person certified-licensed under this Article on one or more of the following
7	grounds:
8	(1) Conviction of a misdemeanor under this Article; or Article.
9	(2) Conviction of a felony under the laws of the United States or of any
10	state of the United States; or States.
11	(3) Gross unprofessional conduct, dishonest practice or incompetence in
12	the practice of counseling; or <u>counseling</u>.
13	(4) Procuring or attempting to procure a certificate of registration-license by
14	fraud, deceit, or misrepresentation; or misrepresentation.
15	(5) Any fraudulent or dishonest conduct in counseling; or <u>counseling</u>.
16	(6) Inability of the person to perform the functions for which a certificate
17	of registration license has been issued due to impairment of mental or
18	physical faculties; or <u>faculties</u>.
19	(7) Violations of any of the provisions of this Article or rules of the Board.
20	(8) <u>Violations of the American Counseling Association Ethical Standards</u>
21	adopted by the Board.
22	"§ 90-341. Violation a misdemeanor.
23	Any person violating any provision of this Article is guilty of a misdemeanor and,
24	upon conviction thereof, may be punishable by fine, by imprisonment, or by both fine
25	and imprisonment.
26	"§ 90-342. Injunction.
27	As an additional remedy, the Board may proceed in a superior court to enjoin and
28	restrain any person from violating the prohibitions of this Article. The Board shall not
29	be required to post bond in connection with such proceeding.
30	" <u>§ 90-343. Disclosure.</u>
31	Any individual, or employer of an individual, who is licensed under this Article may
32	not charge a client or receive remuneration for professional counseling services unless,
33	prior to the performance of those services, the client is furnished a copy of a
34	Professional Disclosure Statement that includes the licensee's professional credentials,
35	the services offered, the fee schedule, and other provisions required by the Board.
36	" <u>§ 90-344. Third-party reimbursements.</u>
37	Nothing in this Article shall be construed to require direct third-party reimbursement
38	to persons licensed under this Article."
39	Sec. 2. G.S. 8-53.8 reads as rewritten:
40	"§ 8-53.8. Counselor privilege.
41	No person, duly registered-licensed pursuant to Chapter 90, Article 24, of the General
42	Statutes, shall be required to disclose any information which he or she may have
43	acquired in rendering professional counseling services, and which information was
44	necessary to enable him or her to render professional counseling services: Provided, that

the presiding judge of a superior or district court may compel such disclosure, if in the
court's opinion the same is necessary to a proper administration of justice and such
disclosure is not prohibited by other statute or regulation."
Sec. 3. G.S. 7A-551 reads as rewritten: **** 7A-551. Privileges not grounds for excluding evidence.**Neither the physician-patient privilege, the psychologist-client privilege, the licensed

7 professional counselor-client privilege, nor the husband-wife privilege shall be grounds 8 for excluding evidence of abuse or neglect in any judicial proceeding (civil, criminal, or 9 juvenile) in which a juvenile's abuse or neglect is in issue nor in any judicial proceeding 10 resulting from a report submitted under this Article, both as said privileges relate to the 11 competency of the witness and to the exclusion of confidential communications." 12 Sec. 4. If any portion of this act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, that

- 13 declaration shall not affect the validity and constitutionality of the remaining portions.
- 14 Sec. 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 1994, except that the Board's rule-
- 15 making authority under this act is effective upon ratification of the act.

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
