1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION TO 3 STUDY VARIOUS ISSUES AFFECTING THE EDUCATION OF AND DELIVERY OF SERVICES TO EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN. 4 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. The Department of Public Instruction shall: 6 Study the need to improve and increase in-service materials, programs, 7 **(1)** and opportunities for regular classroom and exceptional children's 8 teachers. As part of its study, the Department shall identify and 9 evaluate existing in-service materials, programs, and opportunities for 10 these teachers that focus on the individual needs of exceptional 11 children, modification of curriculum and materials, and inclusion of 12 exceptional children in the full range of programs available to all 13 children in the public schools, and shall evaluate services provided by 14 the Regional Educational Training Centers, as established in Part 4 of 15 Article 9 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes. 16 Study the need for appropriately trained exceptional children's teachers (2) 17 and develop a teacher training scholarship program designed to 18 encourage individuals to become exceptional children's teachers in 19 20 public schools. 21 (3) Propose a plan to identify and evaluate the educational expectations of identified exceptional students, including the academically gifted, and 22

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nonidentified disabled students. As part of this plan, the Department

1	shall consider the effects of the following: types and severity of
2	exceptionalities, special education placements, end-of-course tests, the
3	standard course of study, the School Improvement and Accountability
4	Act of 1989, graduation requirements, transition programs, and any
5	other factor it considers appropriate, on these students in any local
6	educational agency. In particular, the plan shall establish goals and
7	measurements for all types of placements, including the regular
8	classroom, for these students.
9	(4) Identify and evaluate the special education and related services needs
10	of low-incidence populations of exceptionalities, and evaluate the
11	feasibility of centralizing resources, personnel, diagnostic services, and
12	other services to address these needs.
13	Sec. 2. The Department of Public Instruction shall make an interim report of
14	its findings and recommendations to the Commission on Children with Special Needs

Sec. 2. The Department of Public Instruction shall make an interim report of its findings and recommendations to the Commission on Children with Special Needs no later than January 15, 1994, and a final report to the Commission on Children with Special Needs no later than October 15, 1994.

Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.

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
