Effective November 1, 1992, July 1, 1995, it shall be unlawful to engage in the 7 (a) practice of electrolysis in this State without a license. 8 9 Any violation of this Chapter shall be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of (b)not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or imprisonment for not more than 60 10 days, or both." 11 12 Sec. 2. G.S. 88A-6(8) reads as rewritten: 13 To-Subject to the provisions of G.S. 88A-7, to employ and fix the "(8) 14 compensation of personnel, including an executive director, that the Board determines are necessary to carry out the provisions of this 15 Chapter and to incur other expenses necessary to effectuate this 16 17 Chapter;". 18 Sec. 3. G.S. 88A-7 reads as rewritten: "§ 88A-7. Custody and use of funds. Applicability of Executive Budget Act; audit 19 20 oversight. 21 The Treasurer or the Executive Director shall deposit all fees payable to the Board in financial institutions designated by the Board as official depositories. The funds shall 22 23 be deposited in the name of the Board and shall be used to pay all expenses incurred by

- 1 the Board in carrying out the purposes of this Chapter. with the State Treasurer, to be
- 2 credited to the account of the Board. These funds shall be held and expended under the
- 3 <u>supervision of the Director of the Budget.</u> The provisions of the Executive Budget Act
- 4 <u>apply to this Chapter.</u> The Board is subject to the oversight of the State Auditor under
- 5 Article 5A of Chapter 147 of the General Statutes."
