 - (3) The University of North Carolina system has a unique contribution to make to economic development due to its access to ongoing research.
 - (4) The extension service of The University of North Carolina system currently serves a function that is only indirectly related to economic development, although, given its regional infrastructure, it could be used for even more direct economic development activity.

Sec. 2. The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina shall, in consultation with the Boards of Trustees of all affected constituent institutions and in consultation with the Economic Development Council created in G.S. 143B-434, study its extension activities and determine the proper role of extension activities in economic development. The Board of Governors shall reassign its extension activities a more active role in economic development if it finds such a role to be appropriate. The Board of Governors shall report to the General Assembly and the Joint Education Oversight Commission by July 1, 1994, on its findings and any action taken with respect to extension activities.

Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
