Part 9, Article 3 of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: 6 "§ 20-129.A. Lighting exemption for farm trailers. 7 Trailers attached to and drawn by either a farm tractor or other motor vehicle 8 shall not be required to be equipped with any lamps required under this Part, including 9 directional signals, rear lamps, stop lamps, marker lamps, clearance lamps, or other 10 auxiliary lamps, when all of the following conditions are met: 12 The trailer is being used by a farmer, his tenant, agent, or employee in (1) transporting his own farm implements, farm supplies, or farm 13 products: 14 The trailer is used during the period between sunrise and sunset; 15 **(2)** There is sufficient light to render clearly discernible any person on the 16 (3) highway at a distance of 400 feet ahead; and 17 Weather conditions do not require the use of windshield wipers, 18 (4) including intermittent use because of fog or misting rain, sleet, or 19 20 snow.
