The General A	ssembly of North Carolina enacts:			
Sect	ion 1. (a) There is created in the Division of Social Services, Department			
of Human Res	sources, a grant program to establish a maximum of 12 Regional Child			
Maltreatment I	Evaluation and Education Centers to provide:			
(1)	Expert evaluations of children suspected of being the victims of child abuse or neglect;			
(2)	Systematic continuing education to Child Medical Examiners, Community Child Protection Team members, health care providers, social workers, guardians <b>ad litem</b> , and other professionals involved in child abuse prevention, evaluation, and treatment;			
(3)	Continuing education to individuals in training, such as medical students, to increase the pool of professionals available to provide evaluations; and			
(4)	Special equipment and special services to Child Medical Examiners and other health care professionals.			
The	Secretary of Human Resources, or the Secretary's designee, shall			
administer the	program.			

1	(b)	The S	ecreta	ry of Human Resources, or the Secretary's designee, upon the
2	advice of	of a rev	iew pa	anel, which should include representatives of law enforcement
3	officers,	district	attorne	eys, medical practitioners, and social workers, shall:
4		(1)	Devel	op a grant application package and provide it to the four medical
5			schoo	ls in the State, teaching hospitals in the State that have major
6			roles	in the residency training of physicians in pediatrics and family
7				eine, and nonprofit organizations in underserved areas of the State
8			that 1	have no residencies but that agree to become involved in
9			contir	nuing education of health, social services, and law enforcement
10			perso	nnel. The package shall include grant proposal instructions and
11			grant-	scoring procedures. Each grant application shall include:
12			a.	Documentation that the existing program or new location has
13				seen at least 100 maltreatment victims for medical evaluations
14				in the past year or has the capacity for such a case load within a
15				year.
16			b.	An agreement to provide:
17				1. Primary multidisciplinary evaluations for children
18				suspected of being victims of child abuse or neglect;
19				2. Second opinions, as requested, to other physicians who
20				conduct maltreatment evaluations but are not affiliated
21				with a center and to county departments of social
22				services; and
23				3. Sexual abuse examinations.
24			c.	Evidence of appropriate laboratory support, either directly or
25				through arrangements with another center or laboratory.
26			d.	A description of the center's anticipated educational efforts,
27				which shall include establishing or enhancing training in the
28				medical aspects of child abuse for medical students, residents,
29				practicing physicians, and other professionals in the
30				community.
31			e.	A description of the center's location and its accessibility to the
32				children and families to be served.
33			f.	A proposed budget that includes the use of grant funds and
34				funds from other sources.

Support the one-time purchase of a colposcope and videotaping 1 (3) 2 equipment: and 3 (4) Support up to ten percent (10%) of a physician's or physician extender's time for educational activities. 4 5 Each center that is eligible for, and receives, a grant under this act may (d) 6 receive supplemental funding if the following additional criteria are met: 7 The center conducted a minimum of 300 multidisciplinary evaluations (1) 8 for children suspected of being victims of child abuse or neglect in the 9 past year, and the center agrees to conduct a minimum of 300 of these 10 evaluations each year. (2) The center is actively involved in the education of medical students, 11 residents, and practicing physicians. 12 13 (3) At least one physician with recognized expertise involved in the 14 provision of services to maltreated children is employed by or 15 affiliated with the center. 16 (4) The center is authorized to provide continuing medical education. 17 (5) The center agrees to provide second opinions, as requested, to Child 18 Medical Examiners. 19 (6) The center agrees to sponsor continuing education courses for 20 professionals in its regions, and to provide training to individual Child 21 Medical Examiners, as requested. 22 **(7)** The center agrees to participate in and support peer review 23 conferences, such as the monthly statewide video conference currently 24 operated by the Child Medical Evaluation Program. The center's budget includes: 25 (8) A maximum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for 26 27 equipment during the first year, and a maximum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for equipment during the second year; 28 29 A maximum of thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) per year b. 30 to employ a full-time social worker or other specially trained professional to assist in the evaluations with child interviews 31 32 and case coordination: A maximum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) per year 33 c. to support a maximum of a three-tenths full-time equivalent 34 35 physician's or physician extender's time to be devoted to education and outreach activities; 36 37 A maximum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) per year for d. 38 educational materials and communication costs; and 39 A maximum of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000) per year for e. travel for education of the professionals staffing the center or 40 41 for provision of education to others. 42 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Division of Social

Services, Department of Human Resources, the sum of eight hundred forty thousand

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1	dollars (\$840,000) for the 1993-94 fiscal year and the sum of six hundred sixty thousand
2	dollars (\$660,000) for the 1994-95 fiscal year to implement this act. Of these funds:
3	(1) The sum of eight hundred forty thousand dollars (\$840,000) for the
4	1993-94 fiscal year shall be used for six grants of up to eighty
5	thousand dollars (\$80,000) and for six grants of up to sixty thousand
6	dollars (\$60,000).
7	(2) The sum of six hundred sixty thousand dollars (\$660,000) for the
8	1994-95 fiscal year shall be used for six grants of up to sixty-five
9	thousand dollars (\$65,000) and for six grants of up to forty-five
10	thousand dollars (\$45,000).
11	Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993.
