6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. Article 4 of Chapter 114 of the General Statutes is amended by
8	adding a new section to read:
9	"§ 114-19.3. Criminal record checks of personnel of area mental health,
10	developmental disabilities, or substance abuse authorities or their
11	<u>contract agencies.</u>
12	The State Bureau of Investigation of the Department of Justice may provide a
13	criminal record check to an area mental health, developmental disabilities, or substance
14	abuse authority of a person who is employed by the area authority or of a person who
15	has applied for employment with the area authority if the employee or applicant
16	consents to the record check. The State Bureau of Investigation may also provide a
17	criminal record check to a contract agency of a person who is employed by the contract
18	agency or of a person who has applied for employment with the contract agency if the
19	employee or applicant consents to the record check. The information provided by the
20	State Bureau of Investigation to an area authority or to a contract agency shall be kept
20 21 22	State Bureau of Investigation to an area authority or to a contract agency shall be kept confidential. A 'contract agency' is a person with whom an area authority has contracted for the provision of certain services under Article 4 of Chapter 122C of the General
