The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
Section 1. G.S. 20-37.7(d) reads as rewritten:	
"(d) A special identification card issued under this section shall expire on the birth

<u>(1)</u>	A supervised publicly or privately operated shelter designed to provide
	temporary living accommodations, including congregated shelters, and
	transitional housing;
<u>(2)</u>	An institution that provides temporary residence for individuals
/2>	intended to be institutionalized; or
<u>(3)</u>	A public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as,
	regular sleeping accommodations for human beings.

The term does not include any individual imprisoned or otherwise detained pursuant to an act of Congress. Annually, the director of a facility which provides care or shelter to homeless persons must certify this fact to the Department of Transportation. The Department shall maintain a list of facilities which are approved by the Department and only letters from the directors of these approved facilities are considered to comply with the provisions of this section.

To have the issuance or renewal fee waived for an identification card, a homeless person must present a letter to the Department from the director of a facility that provides care or shelter to homeless persons verifying that the person named in the letter is homeless, or the homeless person shall sign an affidavit swearing that the person is homeless as defined above.

The fees collected for the issuance of special identification cards to persons under the age of 16 shall be placed in a reserve fund to cover the cost of the operation of the program required by this Article."

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
