2	AN ACT TO CREATE THE NORTH CAROLINA EDUCATION STANDARDS
3	AND ACCOUNTABILITY COMMISSION.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
6	Article to read:
7	"ARTICLE 8A.
8	''NORTH CAROLINA EDUCATION STANDARDS AND
9	ACCOUNTABILITY COMMISSION.

11	The General Assembly believes that all children can learn. The General Assembly
12	further believes that all graduates of North Carolina public schools should have
13	mastered the skills required to become productive members of the workforce and
14	succeed in life. The General Assembly further believes that having a highly qualified
15	workforce is essential to strengthening North Carolina's competitive position in the
16	modern world economy, improving workforce productivity, and ensuring a more
17	prosperous future for all our citizens. With that mission as its guide, the General
18	Assembly creates the North Carolina Education Standards and Accountability
19	Commission.
20	The Commission shall be located administratively in the Office of the Governor but
21	shall exercise all its prescribed statutory powers independently of the Office of the
22	Governor.
