ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY: It is not anticipated that the proposed legislation would have a fiscal impact on the Judicial Branch or more specifically, the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC). Jim Drennan, Director of the AOC, notes that some individuals may contribute a nominal amount of time in setting-up the program, however, most expenses are met through grants. G.S. 7A-38(n) currently states that "The Administrative Office of the Courts may solicit funds from private sources to establish, conduct, and evaluate this pilot program. No State funds shall be used to establish, conduct, or evaluate this program."
