BILL SUMMARY: The bill conforms the State law concerning the registration of certain interstate for-hire motor carriers to the requirements of federal law. It also makes several technical changes to the motor carrier registration laws.

The Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 (ISTEA) directed the federal Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC) to implement a single-state registration system for interstate for-hire motor carriers that are regulated by the ICC. States were required to eliminate the bingo stamp method of registration and replace it with a single-state registration system that is similar to other multi-state registration systems such as the International Registration Plan (IRP) and the International Fuel Tax Agreement (IFTA).

The Division of Motor Vehicles complied with the new federal law effective with the 1994 calendar year. The North Carolina statutes, however, have not been changed and therefore conflict with both federal law and administrative practice.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY: The bill does revise the fee schedule for interstate motor carrier registration. The only substantive changes are the elimination of a \$25 fee for filing a copy of the ICC certificate of authority with DMV and a \$5 fee for filing amendments to the certificate.

These fees have generated less than \$10,000 in past years, and this amount can be easily absorbed within the Division's existing budget.
