10	the principal obligation due at the time of the filing of the proceeding together with
11	interest on the principal amount actually accrued through the date of the order or
12	judgment."
13	<b>SECTION 2.</b> G.S. 47C-4-117 reads as rewritten:
14	"§ 47C-4-117. Effect of violations on rights of action; attorney's fees.
15	If a declarant or any other person subject to this chapter fails to comply with any
16	provision hereof or any provision of the declaration or bylaws, any person or class of
17	person adversely affected by that failure has a claim for appropriate relief. The Except
18	as otherwise provided for in G.S. 47C-3-116(e), the court may award reasonable
19	attorney's fees to the prevailing party."
20	<b>SECTION 3.</b> G.S. 47F-3-116(e) reads as rewritten:
21	"(e) A judgment, decree, or order in any action brought under this section shall
