8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-400 reads as rewritten:
10	"§ 115C-400. School personnel to report child abuse.
11	(a) Any person who has cause to suspect child abuse or neglect has a duty to
12	report the case of the child to the Director of Social Services of the county, as provided
13	in Article 3 of Chapter 7B of the General Statutes.
14	(b) Any person employed by a local school administrative unit who has cause to
15	suspect child abuse allegedly perpetrated by school personnel has a duty to report the
16	case of the child to the appropriate law enforcement agency, the child's parent, and the
17	local director of social services in accordance with Article 3 of Chapter 7B of the
18	General Statutes. Additionally, the report shall be made within 24 hours of learning of
19	the suspected child abuse, and the appropriate law enforcement agency shall initiate a
20	criminal investigation within 48 hours. For purposes of this subsection, the phrase
21	'abused juvenile' as defined in G.S. 7B-101(1), shall include any school personnel
22	suspected of child abuse."
23	SECTION 2. The Department of Public Instruction and the Department of
24	Health and Human Services, Division of Social Services, shall allocate, from funds
25	available, sufficient funds for local school districts to develop procedures and for local
26	law enforcement agencies to conduct investigations as required under Section 1 of this
27	act.
