2	expand or maintain any major north-south interstate route in the State that does not pass			
3	through a municipality with a population greater than 250,000 according to the latest			
4	decennial census."			
5	SECTION 3. G.S. 136-89.160 reads as rewritten:			
6	"§ 136-89.160. Funding for projects.			
7	All expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this Article shall be payable			
8 9	solely from funds, including federal funds, that are now or may become available to the			
9 10	Authority in the future for projects. Any fees collected under this Article shall be			
10	credited to the Highway Trust Fund and used to offset the costs of building, maintaining, or operating the bridge and other related projects. <u>Any fees collected</u>			
11				
12	pursuant to this Article from an interstate toll road shall be used for expanding or maintaining that interstate, or for other transportation-related purposes."			
13 14	SECTION 4. G.S. 136-89.161(a) reads as rewritten:			
15	"(a) There is created a body politic and corporate to be known as the "North			
16	Carolina <u>Toll Road and</u> Bridge Authority". The Authority is constituted a public			
17	agency, and the exercise by the Authority of the powers conferred by this Article in the			
18	construction, operation, and maintenance of the bridge project project, or interstate			
19	expansion, or maintenance project shall be deemed and held to be the performance of an			
20	essential governmental function."			
21	SECTION 5. G.S. 136-89.161(b) reads as rewritten:			
22	"(b) The North Carolina <u>Toll Road and</u> Bridge Authority shall consist of eight			
23	members:			
24	(1) The Secretary of Transportation.			
25	(2) Three members shall be appointed by the Governor, one for a term			
26	expiring on July 1, 1996, one for a term expiring on July 1, 1997, and			
27	one for a term expiring on July 1, 1998. Each subsequent appointment			
28	shall be for a term of four years.			
29	(3) Four members shall be appointed by the General Assembly, two upon			
30	the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and			
31	two upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of			
32	Representatives, in accordance with G.S. 120-121.			
33	a. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall recommend the			
34	appointment of two members, one of whom shall serve a term			
35	expiring June 30, 1997, and one of whom shall serve a term			
36	expiring June 30, 1999. Each subsequent regular appointment			
37	shall be for a term of four years.			
38	b. The Speaker of the House shall recommend the appointment of			
39	two members, one of whom shall serve a term expiring June 30,			
40	1997, and one of whom shall serve a term expiring June 30,			
41	1999. Each subsequent regular appointment shall be for a term			
42	of four years."			
43	SECTION 6. G.S. 136-89.161(h) reads as rewritten:			

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1	"(h) Upon	completion of any bridge constructed pursuant to this Article, or		
2	institution of any toll on an interstate highway, the Authority shall appoint an executive			
3	director, whose salary shall be fixed by the Authority, to serve at its pleasure. Prior to			
4	appointing an Executive Director, the Authority shall confer with the Governor			
5	regarding the p	proposed salary to be paid to the Executive Director. The Executive		
6	Director shall	be responsible for the daily administration of bridges constructed,		
7	maintained, or c	operated pursuant to this Article."		
8	SECT	FION 7. G.S. 136-89.162(a) reads as rewritten:		
9		Authority shall have all of the powers necessary to execute the provisions		
10	of this Article w	which shall include at least the following powers:		
11	(1)	The powers of a corporate body, including the power to sue and be		
12		sued, to make contracts, to adopt and use a common seal, and to alter		
13		the adopted seal as needed.		
14	(2)	To establish, purchase, construct, operate, and regulate toll roads and		
15		bridges and to own, lease, sell, or manage real or personal property.		
16	(3)	To charge and collect tolls and fees for the use of the toll roads and		
17		bridges, for services rendered in the operation of the toll roads and		
18		bridges, or to offset the costs of building the toll roads and bridges. A		
19		toll shall not exceed ten dollars (\$10.00) and an annual fee for a single		
20		vehicle to use the bridge during a year shall not exceed five hundred		
21		dollars (\$500.00). Tolls for interstate highways shall be levied at the		
22		discretion of the Authority, but shall not exceed ten dollars (\$10.00)		
23		and shall be collected only at the Virginia and South Carolina borders		
24		with North Carolina. The Authority shall report its schedule of tolls		
25		and fees to the Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee.		
26	(4)	To rent, lease, purchase, acquire, own, encumber, or dispose of real or		
27		personal property.		
28	(5)	To establish, construct, purchase, maintain, equip, and operate any		
29		structure or facilities associated with a <u>toll road or a</u> bridge.		
30	(6)	To pay all necessary costs and expenses in the formation, organization,		
31		administration, and operation of the Authority.		
32	(7)	To apply for, accept, and administer loans and grants of money from		
33		any federal agency, from the State or its political subdivisions, or from		
34 25	(0)	any other public or private sources available.		
35 26	(8)	To adopt, alter, or repeal its own bylaws or rules implementing the		
36 27	(0)	provisions of this Article.		
37	(9)	To employ consulting engineers, architects, attorneys, real estate		
38		counselors, appraisers, and other consultants and employees as may be		
39 40		required in the judgment of the Authority and to fix and pay their		
40 41	(10)	compensation from funds available to the Authority. To procure and maintain adequate insurance or otherwise provide for		
41 42	(10)	adequate protection to indemnify the Authority and its officers,		
42 43		directors, agents, employees, adjoining property owners, or the general		
Ъ		uncetors, agents, employees, aujoining property owners, or the general		

1	public against loss or liability resulting from any act or omission by or
2	on behalf of the Authority.
3	(11) To receive and use appropriations from the State, including an
4	appropriation from the proceeds of State general obligation bonds or
5	notes."
6	SECTION 8. This act is effective when it becomes law.
