The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 115C-84.2(a)(1) reads as rewritten:

4	SECTION 2. This act applies only to local school administrative units
5	located in whole or in part in the counties that (i) were declared by the President of the
6	United States to be a disaster area for Hurricane Frances, Hurricane Ivan, or both and
7	(ii) have missed more than 13 instructional days during the 2004-2005 school year due
8	to all inclement weather including flooding from Hurricane Frances, Hurricane Ivan, or
9	both.
10	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act applies to the 2004-2005 school year only.
11	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
