5	SEC	TION 1.(a) Commission Established. – There is established in the
6	General Assem	bly a Joint Legislative Commission on Expanding Rail Service.
7	SEC	TION 1.(b) Membership. – The Commission shall be composed of 16
8	members as follows:	
9	(1)	Eight members of the House of Representatives appointed by the
10		Speaker of the House of Representatives.
11	(2)	Eight members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore
12		of the Senate.
13	SEC	TION 1.(c) Duties of Commission The Commission shall study the
14	following matte	ers related to expanding rail service in North Carolina:
15	(1)	The cost and benefits of expanding and upgrading rail service in the
16		State, including the effect the expanded service would have on
17		economic development.
18	(2)	The feasibility, cost, and benefits of establishing commuter rail service
19		in the State to transport workers to cities from outlying areas,
20		including the effect the commuter service would have on increasing
21		the economic opportunities of those who live in the outlying areas.
22	(3)	The cost and benefits of expanding passenger rail service to the
23		western and eastern areas of the State, including the effect the
24		expanded service would have on tourism.
25	(4)	Ways to preserve unused or abandoned rail corridors for future rail
26		needs.

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1	(5) Spurring economic development and tourism through further		
2	development of short-line railroads.		
3	SECTION 1.(d) Vacancies. – Any vacancy on the Commission shall be		
4	filled by the appointing authority.		
5	SECTION 1.(e) Cochairs. – Cochairs of the Commission shall be designated		
6	by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the		
7	Senate from among their respective appointees. The Commission shall meet upon the		
8	call of the chairs. A quorum of the Commission shall be nine members.		
9	SECTION 1.(f) Expenses of Members. – Members of the Commission shall		
10	receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowances in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1,		
11	138-5, or 138-1, as appropriate.		
12	SECTION 1.(g) Staff. – Adequate staff shall be provided to the Commission		
13	by the Legislative Services Office.		
14	SECTION 1.(h) Consultants. – The Commission may hire consultants to		
15	assist with the study. Before expending any funds for a consultant, the Commission		
16	shall report to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations on the		
17	consultant selected, the work products to be provided by the consultant, and the cost of		
18	the contract, including an itemization of the cost components.		
19	SECTION 1.(i) Cooperation. – The Commission may call upon any		
20	department, agency, institution, or officer of the State or any political subdivision		
21	thereof for facilities, data, or other assistance.		
22	SECTION 1.(j) Meetings During Legislative Session. – The Commission		
23	may meet during a regular or extra session of the General Assembly, subject to approval		
24	of the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the		
25	Senate.		
26 27	SECTION 1.(k) Meeting Location. – The Commission shall meet at various		
27 28	locations around the State in order to promote greater public participation in its deliberations. The Legislative Services Commission shall grant adequate meeting space		
28 29	to the Commission in the State Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building.		
29 30	SECTION 1.(I) Report. – The Commission shall make an interim report of		
31	its findings and recommendations to the 2006 Regular Session of the 2005 General		
32	Assembly and shall make a final report of its findings and recommendations to the 2007		
33	General Assembly. Upon the filing of its final report, the Commission shall terminate.		
33 34	SECTION 1.(m) Appropriation. – Of the funds appropriated to the General		
35	Assembly, the Legislative Services Commission shall allocate sufficient funds for the		
36	expenses of the Commission.		
37	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
