7	SPECIAL ONETIME PERMITS ISSUED WITHIN THREE BUSINESS DAYS OF THE

9	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
10	SECTION 1. G.S. 18B-900(a) reads as rewritten:			
11	"(a)	Requi	rements To be eligible to receive and to hold an ABC permit, a person	
12	shall:			
13		(1)	Be at least 21 years old, unless the person is a manager of a business selling	
14			only malt beverages and unfortified wine, in which case the person shall be	
15			at least 19 years old;	
16		(2)	Be a resident of North Carolina unless:	
17			a. He is an officer, director or stockholder of a corporate applicant or	
18			permittee and is not a manager or otherwise responsible for the	
19			day-to-day operation of the business; or	
20			b. He has executed a power of attorney designating a qualified resident	
21			of this State to serve as attorney in fact for the purposes of receiving	
22			service of process and managing the business for which permits are	
23			sought; or	
24			c. He is applying for a nonresident malt beverage vendor permit, a	
25		(2)	nonresident wine vendor permit, or a vendor representative permit;	
26		(3)	Not have been convicted of a felony within three years, and, if convicted of a	
27		(4)	felony before then, shall have had his citizenship restored;	
28		(4)	Not have been convicted of an alcoholic beverage offense within two years;	
29		(5)	Not have been convicted of a misdemeanor controlled substance offense	
30		(6)	within two years; and	
31		(6)	Not have had an alcoholic beverage permit revoked within three years,	
32			except where the revocation was based solely on a permittee's failure to pay	
33			the annual registration and inspection fee required in G.S. 18B-903(b1).

- (7) Not have, whether as an individual or as an officer, director, shareholder or manager of a corporate permittee, an unsatisfied outstanding final judgment that was entered against him in an action under Article 1A of this Chapter.
- (8) Have a valid social security number or be able to produce valid documentation issued to the applicant under the authority of the United States government demonstrating legal presence in the United States.

To avoid undue hardship, however, the Commission may decline to take action under G.S. 18B-104 against a permittee who is in violation of subdivisions (3), (4), or (5)."

SECTION 2. G.S. 18B-1002(d) reads as rewritten:

"(d) Administrative Procedure. – A permit issued pursuant to this section shall not be issued less than 10 days before any qualifying event described in subdivisions (1) through (5) of subsection (a) of this section. The Commission shall notify the ALE Division not more than three business days after the date a permit is issued pursuant to this section, of the name and address of the applicant, the address of the event, and any conditions placed on the permit pursuant to subsection (c) of this section. Denial or revocation of a permit under this section shall not entitle the applicant or permittee to a hearing under Chapter 150B."

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to permits issued on or after that date.
