## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ENSURE THAT LOCAL SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS HAVE
ADEQUATE FUNDS TO HIRE TEACHER ASSISTANTS FOR THE 2014-2015
SCHOOL YEAR AND TO CLARIFY THE QUARTER-CENT LOCAL OPTION SALES
TAX AUTHORITY FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 SECTION 1.(a) Notwithstanding G.S. 115C-105.25(b)(5b), local school 8 administrative units may convert positions allocated for classroom teachers to dollar 9 equivalents and transfer the funds into the teacher assistant allotment at the statewide average 10 salary for classroom teachers; provided, however, for each local school administrative unit, the sum of the amount initially allotted for teacher assistants for the 2014-2015 fiscal year and the 11 12 amount transferred under this subsection shall not exceed the amount expended from the local school administrative unit's teacher assistant allotment in the 2013-2014 fiscal year by more 13 14 than two percent (2%).

SECTION 1.(b) Local school administrative units may convert additional positions
 allocated for classroom teachers to dollar equivalents and transfer the funds into the teacher
 assistant allotment in accordance with G.S. 115C-105.25(b)(5b).

**SECTION 1.(c)** This section applies to the 2014-2015 fiscal year only.

**SECTION 1.(d)** This section becomes effective July 1, 2014.

20 **SECTION 2.(a)** If House Bill 1224, 2013 Regular Session, becomes law, then 21 G.S. 115C-429(b), as amended by House Bill 1224, reads as rewritten:

22 The board of county commissioners shall complete its action on the school budget "(b) on or before July 1, or such later date as may be agreeable to the board of education. The 23 24 commissioners shall determine the amount of county revenues to be appropriated in the county 25 budget ordinance to the local school administrative unit for the budget year. The board of county commissioners may, in its discretion, allocate part or all of its appropriation by purpose, 26 function, or project as defined in the uniform budget format. For allocations made by the board 27 28 of county commissioners for the purpose of or for a function related to instructional services, that are derived from a tax levied under Article 43A of Chapter 105 of the General 29 Statutes, the board of county commissioners may direct the amount of funds to be used for 30 31 salaries of classroom teachers, salaries of classroom teacher assistants, and supplements of 32 classroom teacher salaries. For the purposes of this section, a classroom teacher is an employee of a local board of education employed as a teacher who spends at least seventy percent (70%) 33 of his or her work time in classroom instruction, and a classroom teacher assistant is an 34

5	"(b) If the board of county commissioners allocates part or all of its appropriations				
6	pursuant to G.S. 115C-429(b), the board of education must obtain the approval of the board of				
7	county commissioners for an amendment to the budget that does any of the following:				
8	(1) Increases or decreases expenditures from the capital outlay fund for projects				
9	listed in G.S. 115C-426(f)(1) or (2).				
10	(2) Increases or decreases the amount of county appropriation allocated to a				
11	purpose or function by twenty-five percent (25%) or more from the amount				
12	contained in the budget ordinance adopted by the board of county				
13	commissioners: provided, that at its discretion, the board may in its budget				
14	ordinance specify a lesser percentage, so long as such percentage is not less				
15	than ten percent (10%).				
16	(3) Decreases the amount of funds allocated for salaries of classroom teachers,				
17	salaries of classroom teacher assistants, and supplements of classroom				
18	teacher salaries. salaries that is derived from a tax levied under Article 43A				
19	of Chapter 105 of the General Statutes. For the purposes of this section, a				
20	classroom teacher is an employee of a local board of education employed as				
21	a teacher who spends at least seventy percent (70%) of his or her work time				
22	in classroom instruction, and a classroom teacher assistant is an employee of				
23	a local board of education employed as a teacher assistant who spends at				
24	least seventy percent (70%) of his or her work time assisting in a				
25	classroom."				
26	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective only if House Bill 1224, 2013 Regular				
27	Session, becomes law.				
28	<b>SECTION 4.</b> Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes				
29	law.
