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- to require each ambulatory surgical facility licensed under this Part to have a minimum of one circulating nurse physically present in each operating room for the duration of each surgical procedure to (i) coordinate the nursing care and safety needs of patients in the operating room and (ii) support the surgical team as appropriate during surgery. As used in this section, "circulating nurse" means a registered nurse licensed to practice under Chapter 90 of the General Statutes who is educated and trained in perioperative nursing.
