A SENATE RESOLUTION HONORING THE LEADERSHIP AND FORESIGHT OF
THOSE NORTH CAROLINIANS WHO CREATED AND ESTABLISHED THE
COMMUNITY COLLEGES AND JOINING NORTH CAROLINA'S FIFTY-EIGHT
COMMUNITY COLLEGES AND THE COMMUNITY COLLEGES SYSTEM OFFICE
WHILE OBSERVING THE FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE NORTH CAROLINA
COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM.

7 Whereas, Dr. W. Dallas Herring responded to Governor Luther Hodges in 1957 and 8 prepared a plan for industrial education that resulted in the establishment by the General 9 Assembly of a statewide system of industrial education centers and the creation of a system of 10 public junior colleges; and

11 Whereas, Dr. Herring worked tirelessly with Governor Terry Sanford and others to 12 merge the two systems into a comprehensive community college system encompassing 13 workforce training and college studies; and

Whereas, the Omnibus Higher Education Act, also known as Senate Bill 72, was passed on May 17, 1963, by the General Assembly, creating the North Carolina Department of Community Colleges, which included the original 20 industrial education centers, along with six junior colleges and five extension units; and

Whereas, this act became effective on July 1, 1963; and

19 Whereas, in 1963, there were 31 community colleges with a total of 79,117 20 students; and

Whereas, since 1963, North Carolina has supported the growth of this education and
training system into the 58 community colleges that serve all 100 North Carolina counties
today; and

24 Whereas, today, North Carolina community colleges serve over 850,000 students 25 annually; and

Whereas, the North Carolina Community College System has been recognized, nationally and internationally, through the decades as a leader in workforce development; and

Whereas, the 58 community colleges in North Carolina have responded to the call for employee preparedness for thousands of North Carolina businesses and industries; and

30 Whereas, millions of North Carolinians have taken their first steps toward technical 31 and higher education certificates, diplomas, and degrees at these colleges through the years; 32 and

33 Whereas, generations of North Carolina families have received education and 34 training that has improved their quality of life; and

| 14 | Carolinians who created and established the community colleges and joins North Carolina's 58 |
| 15 | community colleges and the Community Colleges System Office in observing the 50th |
| 16 | anniversary of the North Carolina Community College System. |
| 17 | SECTION 2. The Senate expresses appreciation for the System's contribution to |
| 18 | the workforce development of millions of North Carolinians. |
| 19 | SECTION 3. The Principal Clerk shall transmit a copy of this resolution to the |
| 20 | President of the North Carolina Community College System. |
| 21 | SECTION 4. This resolution is effective upon adoption. |
