A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO PERMIT DISCLOSURE OF CERTAIN INFORMATION PERTAINING TO 3 WORKERS' COMPENSATION COVERAGE BY THE NORTH CAROLINA 4 INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE 5 COMMITTEE ON WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE COVERAGE 6 COMPLIANCE AND FRAUD PREVENTION AND DETECTION.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 8

SECTION 1. G.S. 58-36-17 reads as rewritten:

Bureau to share information with the North Carolina Industrial 9 "§ **58-36-17**. 10 Commission.

11 The Bureau shall provide to the North Carolina Industrial Commission information 12 contained in the Bureau's records indicating the status of workers' compensation insurance coverage on North Carolina employers as reported to the Bureau by the Bureau's member 13 14 companies. The North Carolina Industrial Commission shall take such steps, including obtaining software or software licenses, as are necessary to be able to receive and process such 15 information from the Bureau. The records provided to the North Carolina Industrial 16 Commission under this section shall be confidential and shall not be public records as that term 17 is defined in G.S. 132-1. Notwithstanding the previous sentence and with respect to policies 18 becoming effective on and after January 1, 2012, the North Carolina Industrial Commission 19 may release data showing workers workers' compensation insurance policy information that 20 includes only only: employer name and address; carrier name, address, and telephone number; 21 policy number; policy effective dates, dates; policy cancellation dates, dates; and policy 22 23 reinstatement dates. This data shall not be confidential data and shall be a public record as that term is defined in G.S. 132-1. The North Carolina Industrial Commission shall use the 24 25 information provided pursuant to this section only to carry out its statutory duties and obligations under The North Carolina Workers' Compensation Act. The Bureau shall be 26 immune from civil liability for releasing information pursuant to this section, even if the 27 information is erroneous, provided the Bureau acted in good faith and without malicious or 28 willful intent to harm in releasing the information." 29

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SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.



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
