

1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF NORTH CAROLINA TO PROTECT
3	THOSE WHOSE PROPERTY IS BEING TAKEN BY EMINENT DOMAIN BY
4	PROVIDING THAT WHEN A LOCAL GOVERNMENT CONDEMNOR IS NOT AN
5	ELECTED BOARD, A MAJORITY OF THE ELECTED BOARDS APPOINTING IT
6	MUST APPROVE FILING OF THE CONDEMNATION ACTION.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	SECTION 1. Article I of the North Carolina Constitution is amended by adding a
9	new section to read:
10	"Sec. 19.1. Eminent domain by local governments.
11	If the General Assembly authorizes by law the exercise of the power of eminent domain by
12	any local governmental subdivision, including a board or commission of such subdivision or a
13	special district or local authority, and the governing body of that entity is not composed entirely
14	of persons elected by the people (other than persons appointed to fill vacancies in an elective
15	office), then prior to the commencement of any condemnation action, the condemnation action
16	may be filed only if a majority of the members of that entity are appointed by boards consisting
17	of elected officials and a majority of all the entities making appointments to that entity have
18	approved initiation of the condemnation action."
19	SECTION 2. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act shall be submitted to
20	the qualified voters of the State at a statewide election to be conducted on November 4, 2014,
21	which election shall be conducted under the laws then governing elections in the State. Ballots,
22	voting systems, or both may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 of the General Statutes.
23	The question to be used in the voting systems and ballots shall be:
24	"[] FOR [] AGAINST
25	Constitutional amendment to prohibit condemnation of private property by an
26	appointed local government board or authority unless the elected officials making appointments
27	to that board have approved of the condemnation action."
28	SECTION 3. If a majority of votes cast on the question are in favor of the
29	amendment set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the
30	amendment to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall enroll the amendment so
31	certified among the permanent records of that office. The amendment set out in Section 1 of
32	this act becomes effective upon certification and applies to takings after that date.
33	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
